When Bid Surety is required, proposals shall be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check or a bid bond, payable to the City of Portland for an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the aggregate amount of the bid as guaranty that the bid shall be irrevocable for the period specified in the proposal. Said bond to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages should the bidder seek to revoke his offer for any reason not authorized by law and not consented to by City within the irrevocable period, or neglect or refuse to enter into contract and provide a suitable bond for the faithful performance of the contract, in the event the said contract is awarded to him.

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed proposals for the construction of Old Town Street and Storm Sewer Improvements (Community Development Block Grant Project No. 1036) within the City of Sherwood, Oregon, will be received at the office of Tad Milburn, City Administrator, City of Sherwood, 90 N.W. Park Street, Sherwood, Oregon 97140 until 10:00 a.m. Pacific Standard Time, on the 9th day of September, 1980, and then will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The work contemplated consists of schedules of the proposal as follows:

SCHEDULE I - Street Improvements - Construction consists of 1,280 cubic yards of excavation, 2,259 linear feet of concrete curb construction, 3,162 square yards of two- (2) inch compacted thickness of Class C asphalt concrete pavement on base rock, 135 square yards of one and one-half (1-1/2) inches compacted thickness of Class C asphalt concrete overlay, eleven (11) catch basins, 270 linear feet of storm sewer lateral construction, 200 square feet of sidewalk construction, and other miscellaneous construction items.

SCHEDULE II - Storm Sewer Improvements - Construction consists of 1,146 linear feet of eighteen (18) inch concrete sewer pipe, thirty-six (36) linear feet of fifteen- (15) inch concrete sewer pipe, 747.5 linear feet of twelve- (12) inch concrete sewer pipe, eight (8) standard manholes, one (1) ditch inlet, one (1) outfall structure with rip rap, and pavement restoration.

A copy of said documents may be obtained at the office of the City Administrator, City of Sherwood, 90 N.W. Park Street, Sherwood, Oregon 97140 upon deposit of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each document. The full amount of the deposit will be refunded if said documents are returned in good condition within ten (10) days after the award of the contract.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond payable to the City of Sherwood, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the amount bid.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Performance and Payment Bond for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the Contract price.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum salaries and wages as set forth in the Contract Documents must be paid on this project in accordance with ORS 279.350, and that the Contractor must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder; the City of Sherwood reserves the right to reject any or all proposals. The City of Sherwood also reserves the right to postpone award of the Contract for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from date of bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and to accept that proposal which is to the best interests of the City of Sherwood.

Completed prequalification forms must be received by the office of Gary M. Buford & Associates, Inc., 415 N. State Street, Lake Oswego, Oregon 97034 ten (10) calendar days before bid opening. Failure to submit prequalification forms ten (10) days in advance will result in automatic disqualification of the bidder. The Engineer shall notify all noneligible bidders seven (7) days before bid opening.

Prequalifications forms shall be in accordance with ORS 279.039. Forms may be obtained from the State of Oregon Public Contract Review Board, Salem, Oregon 97310, or from the City of Sherwood Administrative Offices.

Sealed proposals to furnish materials, equipment, labor and services of all kinds for the construction of Water Supply Project, Phase II: Water Transmission Pipelines will be received by the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation at the Tribal Administration Building, Warm Springs, Oregon 97661, until the time and date stated below, and immediately thereafter such proposals will be publicly opened and read. Bid envelopes shall be marked with the name of the bidder and the title of the job:

The work to be performed includes installation of approximately 85,300 linear feet of ductile iron, steel, and/or concrete cylinder water transmission pipelines ranging in size from 18-inch to 8-inch together with valves, blowoffs, outlets drains, appurtenances, and related work. The work has been divided into three schedules, Schedules A, B, and C. Schedule A includes approximately 18,200 linear feet of 18-inch steel or concrete cylinder pipe; Schedule B includes approximately 25,100 linear feet of 14-inch and approximately 15,500 linear feet of 12-inch ductile iron, steel or concrete cylinder pipe; and Schedule C includes approximately 23,300 linear feet of 10-inch ductile iron, steel, or concrete cylinder pipe, and approximately 3,200 feet of 8-inch ductile iron or steel pipe. Bidders may submit bids on one or all schedules or any combination of schedules as described in the specification.

(Continued from Page 1 col 6) obligations regarding regularly employed teachers or those with re-employment rights, shall be observed;

J) All target schools defined in the Comprehensive Desegregation Plan shall be affected by this regulation;

K) All other District PK-12 schools shall be encouraged to implement this regulation but it shall be permissive in each instance upon the request of the local school citizen advisory committee in consultation with the building principal.

Glenn Hill, president of the Portland Association of Teachers, angrily denounced the Board's plan, accusing it of responding to a "special interest group" and calling the proposed action "one more slap in the face." Hill said the teachers are not opposed to parent involvement in the schools but "we are opposed to having parents hire faculty." In response to questions from the Board Hill said he considers the Board's interest in parent participation to be a response to a Black "power group."

He asked the Board to discuss the issue with teacher representatives outside the "circus of a public forum."

The Board motion would have adopted a "Commitment to Substance" which would have used these procedures as a base, but ordered the Superintendent to seek further input from the community and staff and determine a final procedure by November 1st.

Acceptance by the Black United Front would now involve trust that the final regulations would have the same basic guarantee for parents.

After failing to pass the above procedures, the Board considered adopting a resolution that would tell

the Superintendent design regulations.

Priestley refused to support that motion saying, "The members of the Board are trying to hand the BUF an empty sack." He explained that true parent participation has been blocked by the "old Board," the previous administration (Blanchard) and the teacher organization. By passing a meaningless policy, some board members "want to obviate the political interest of the teachers who confronted us with a drawn sword." He called the lesser motion a "skirmish" to get around teacher objection, stating he favors meaningful parent participation. Priestley said, "If we can't achieve it we can't. We have a concerned Superintendent who has more courage than some members of the Board."

"I try to support the interest of the teachers...but also intend to support the interest of parents. This causes me to reject this motion and I will join the call for a boycott."

Cawthorne voted for the motion, which failed, because it would indicate the Board's concern about citizen participation.

The Board will meet Thursday at 7:30 to continue the discussion. The Black United Front will meet at the same time at King Neighborhood Facility.
