# All-Star band

Dr. William Foster, Director of Bands at Florida A&M University, Tallahassee, has been named Director of the 1980 McDonald's All-American High School Band.

As director of the All-American Band, Foster will conduct the Band's performances in the nationally-televised Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York and a holiday concert at Carnegie Hall.

During his distinguished musical career, Dr. Foster has created more than 200 band pageants performed by the Florida A&M University Marching Band for nearly 700 million people throughout the country. Also under Foster's direction, the Florida A&M University Symphonic Band is renowned for its concert performances.

For his work with studentmusicians, Foster has earned a number of honors and awards, including a resolution issued by the Florida Legislature for Distinctive Achievement, a Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association, and a Distinguished Service Award from his alma mater, the University of Kansas. He holds a doctorate degree from Teachers College at Columbia University.

As an adjudicator, clinician, lecturer and consultant, Foster has appeared at more than 35 colleges and universities. He is the author of the textbook, Band Pageantry, and has published numerous articles in music education magazines.
