Born in Champaign, Illinois in 1926, Eugene McDuffy - better known as Jack McDuff - has been playing music all his life. In a recent interview in Contemporary Keyboard Magazine, Jack says, "When I was little, we had an organ you had to pump with your feet, and I could kick out a tune. But it had to be a church tune. If my folks heard me playing Boggie Woggie, they'd come up and pop me in the mouth. I had to go next door, where there was a piano, to even play a blues tune. The first tune I could play was "After Hours," and I've gotten away from the blues roots."

Today with more than 40 albums under his belt, the latest being


