ACT-SO competition

When Commissioner McCoy was asked if there shouldn't have been a contingency plan in the event that no one scores in the 90s, and shouldn't the students have been aware of that plan, she said, "When you have to make a decision of that size under pressure, you very often don't make the best decision. We were simply caught in a situation without a second plan." She continued to say that there needs to be a way to screen the students so that the judges are not caught by surprise. She also said that she personally feels that an apology to the students is in order.

But still, despite the committee's attempt to rectify things . . . still, no one is going to the nationals. This decision on the part of the judges has brought with it at least two serious questions: 1) Does this decision imply that Portland has no Black talent? 2) Are the judges aware of something about the caliber of the national competition from year to year. How else would they be able to determine whether or not someone is worth sending. In reply to these questions Commissioner McCoy said that this year ACT-SO dealt with only 20 students of all the Black high school students in Portland. "Therefore I can't understand how anyone could construe that to mean that Portland has no Black talent." She went on to say that the judges know about the caliber of the national competitions "because they just get sharper and sharper."
Luscious Hicks, president of the

Portland Branch, NAACP, the organization which originated and sponsors the ACT-SO program, speaks on a question about the future of the ACT-SO program in light of what has gone on. "I think the impact of the situation has a very positive potential because it creates a need for better communication between students, coaches, etc., and a need for more crystallization of expectations. What do the judges expect from the students; what do the students expect from the judges?"

The Friends of ACT-SO Committee raised \$4,000 to cover the costs of the competitions, publicity, etc. and to cover the expense of sending someone to the nationals. U.S. National Bank gave a \$3,000 challenge grant which was met . . . a total of \$7,000. The committee is strongly considering investing the money to better next year's ACT-SO program.

It appears that the ACT-SO committee should consider the possibility that the judges were judging according to their own level of expertise - ignoring that the participants are high school students.

Perhaps the best explanation of the entire evening is expressed by Master of Ceremonies Art Alexander. "It seemed like it was a case of judges losing their perspective and carrying a well-intentioned principle to an unnecessary extreme."

As people left the auditorium a participating student was overheard expressing frustration and anger because of what had happened. Next week, we will talk to some of those students and their parents.
