(Continued from Page 1 Col 6) list containing the top three minority or female applicants. He could hire any of the six applicants for the position.

Calling the rule "innocuous," the Court said, "it simply provides a method by which City bureaus, offices, and departments may attempt to comply with federal, state and City equal opportunity employment goals where they - not the Board - find and certify that such an attempt is warranted." The rule does not require that City authorities request a second list or hire from it.

The Court declared that the rule does not result in less qualified employees since all who are on the list

have received a passing score and are thereby deemed qualified. The applicants score is not the only factor that can be considered for hiring, therefore frequently a person with a lower score might be hired.

The Court determined that there is no evidence that the rule discriminates against the Police Association or its members, or that it will promote intergroup hostility, resentment, distrust or tension.

The "two-list" rule was proposed by Commissioner Charles Jordan in an effort to assist City bureaus, including the Police Bureau, to hire minorities and to reach affirmative action goals. It was unanimously enacted by the City Council.
