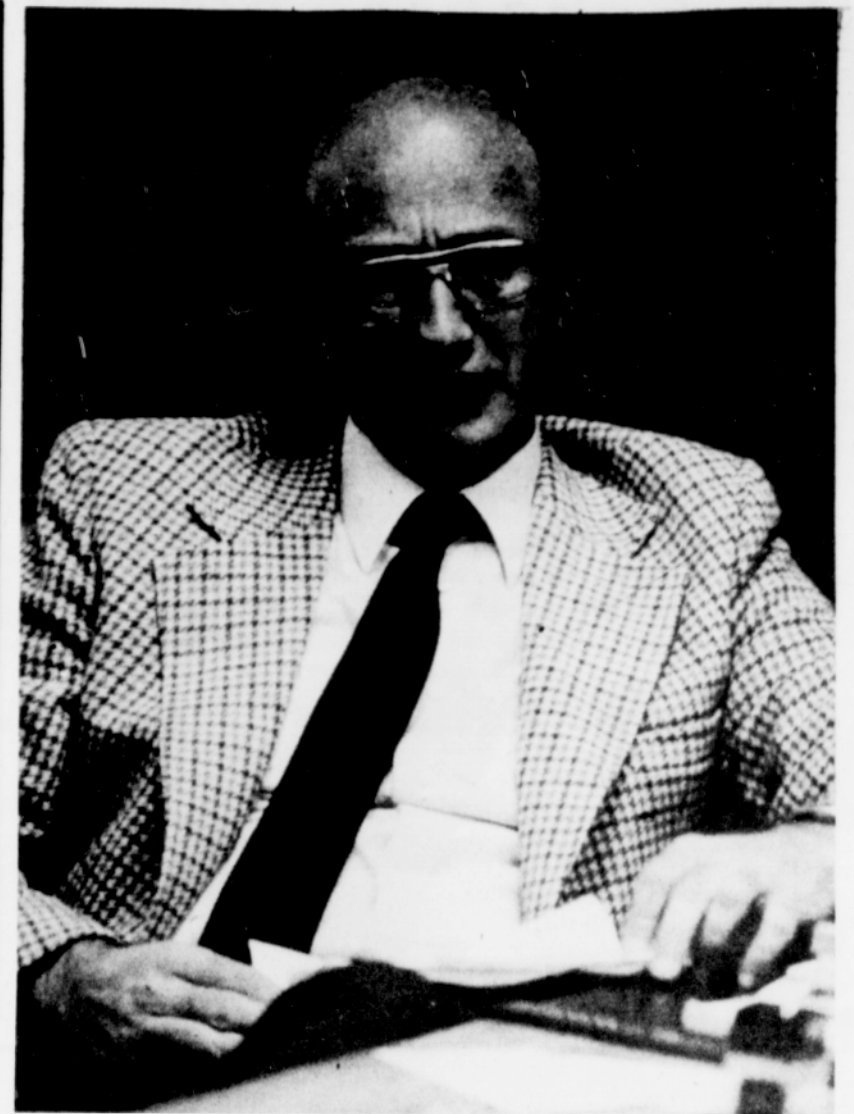

PCC expands Cascade

"Portland Community College's Cascade Campus," located at 705 N. Killingsworth, "will become a totally comprehensive campus," said Dr. John H. Anthony, President.

To be a totally comprehensive campus means Cascade next year will offer vocational and technical programs as well as academic and college preparatory programs.

Although the state budget, and the federal grant programs will affect PCC's overall budget expenditure, Cascade is to receive top priority in this development program.

"Beginning Fall Term a computer field service technology program will be offered at Cascade," Anthony said.

"There is no other program like it in the Northwest. The program will be recruitment, training and job placement for 18-year-olds and up."

The Cascade Campus is centrally located to technological enterprises

in and around the City. Another program, micro-processing transistor field, is scheduled to be a part of the comprehensive outlook.

Digital, and hopefully Textronic, will contribute equipment for the technological program, Anthony said.

For this project, to date, \$80,000 has been received from vocational educational funds. An additional \$75,000 out of the PCC budget will be used for remodeling and construction of a new building, classrooms and lab.

"Community involvement is extremely important," Anthony said. Cascade's advisory committee is being restructured to better involve the community.

PCC has received a lot of support and input from the community based groups, Anthony said. Dean James Van Dyke, who heads Cascade, is working in conjunction with representatives from a number of organizations within the community to set up programs that will best serve the community.
