Bruce Smith - Jefferson High School graduate; graphics - 1968-1971, Lewis and Clark College; Art design and Calligraphy. Musical Training: Studied under the direction of Master drummers such as: Mychal Smith (Percussionist for Cal Tjader), February, 1971, Portland, OR; Bill Summers (Percussionist for T.V. Movie "Roots"), September, 1974; June, 1975; March, 1977, Oakland, CA.: Leonard Gibbs (Yoruba Drummer), July, 1977; November, 1978, Philadelphia, Penn.; Obo Addy (Master Drummer from Ghana, Africa), August, 1979; February, 1981 to Present, Portland, OR.; Jalal Sharriff (Jimbe Drummer from Sudan, Africa), April, 1981, Portland, OR.

Experience: Musician on nationally known record albums: Pleasure - Fantasy Studios; Jeff Lorber Fusion, Ripcord Studio; Wayne Henderson, Fantasy Studios; Ronnie Laws, Total Experience Studios.

Theatre and Stage: Designed clothing for the Portland Black Repretory Theatre production of "Stardust" (1977); "For Colored Girls..." (1979); "Potolo" (1980) and "Red Beans and Rice" (1980). Designer for the national recording artists "Pleasure." Recently designed Braid Sculpture for one of the internationally famed "Sister Sledge." Lectured throughout the Portland and Washington area schools (elementary to college) regarding the esthetics of Art relating to Hair and Textiles.

These are just some of the accomplishments Chonitia and Bruce have made as a result of their dedication as Black artist.

by master musician Roy Ayers.




