Journalists visit guerrilla camp

The chaos of the tiny, war-torn country of El Salvador receives "local" treatment in a half-hour special, "Poor El Salvador" airing Sunday, August 23, 1981, at 6 p.m. on KGW-TV, Channel 8.

KGW-TV sister station KING-TV in Seattle sent reporter Don McGaffin and cinematographer Randy Partin to El Salvador earlier this year to examine the political turmoil that pervades that country. "Poor El Salvador" contains film of McGaffin and Partin's capture by guerrillas and their subsequent transfer to a guerrilla refugee camp. In the camp, we see the faces of the freedom fighters, many of them teenagers and women.

"Poor El Salvador" deals with the country's history, economy, and

diverse religious and political philosophies and the oppression that produces the bitter violence that has resulted in 16,000 political killings in less than two years.

The film addresses the revolution in a humanitarian manner, discussing the terrible toll on the nation's children and families. It also belies the U.S. government's line that the guerrillas have been badly defeated. However, it perpetuates the myth that the war is between the extreme left and the extreme right while picturing the ruling junta as moderate, and depicts the right wing terror against the people as being an army "out of control" rather than as a policy of the government.
