Reverend Johnson dies

are temporarily displaced and have no where to live.

Rev. Johnson was born in Beaumont, Texas. He served in the U.S. Army for 10 years, and after discharge moved to Portland and worked for the postal service. He was an associate minister and head of youth work at William Temple Church of God in Christ. He was a counselor during the early days of the Albina Youth Opportunity School.

During his 13 years as pastor of Highland Church, he served the community in many capacities. He was a founder and board member of Highland Community Services, Inc., a member of the board for Homeland Ministries of the United Church of Christ, and served as

director of community programs for the Albina Ministerial Alliance. He made his church building available to community programs, including the AMA Family Day and Night Care Program, and his time available to counsel young people.

At the time of his death, Rev. Johnson directed a program for training minorities for the Oregon State Department of Transportation.

Survivors include his wife, Opal; a daughter, Vera Lynn Jones; sons, Samuel, Jr., and Richard, and one grandchild, Chris Jones II.
