

Receives award Governor signs racial harassment law



Governor Victor Atiyeh signs racial/religious harassment law.

On Friday, August 21st, at 3:15 pm, Oregon's new racial harassment law became effective, signed by Governor Victor Atiyeh. The law, which was adopted by the legislature on the last day of its long session, makes racial or religious intimidation a class A misdemeanor, and conspiracy to intimidate because of race, color, religion or national origin a class C felony. The law was requested by Governor Atiyeh in response to the increasing frequency of racial and religious harassment and intimidation in Oregon.

During the signing ceremony, attended by representatives of many minority and religious groups that supported the law, Governor Atiyeh was presented the Meritorious Service Award, the highest award given by the U.S. Justice Department's Community Relations Service.

Robert Lamb, Jr., Director of the Northwest Regional Office, told the Governor, "... we are indeed grateful for your leadership and for your prompt action in response to growing racial incidents here in the State of Oregon... We believe, indeed we know, that your stand against racial hate and harassment here in Oregon is important and timely, and serves as a national model, especially when viewed against the backdrop of racial incidents plaguing the nation and the resurgence of hate groups."

(Continued from page 1 col. 6) wrong. Johnson said Waddell had told him that he had already returned the license that morning. (A police officer did go to the house next door but left without talking to anyone, and the license was not found in that mailbox either.)

Johnson said there was nothing he could do and advised Franklin to call McCabe again. He also suggested that Franklin drive without the license and, if stopped by another officer, tell him what had happened and have him call McCabe.

Not satisfied, Brewer called McCabe. McCabe could not contact Waddell because he had the afternoon off. His suggestion was that Franklin drive without a license and then bring him the tickets. He rejected the use of his name: "Just

keep my name out of the streets." Brewer reports that McCabe offered to pay any expense of getting a new Arizona license.

Captain McCabe verified that Waddell did take the license and that his taking it was not legal. Waddell told him that he took it to prevent Franklin from using it because it was not valid in Oregon. "His superior officers have talked to him about this incident," Waddell claims that he went to Franklin's house, knocked on the door, and when no one answered he put the license in the mailbox. "Franklin needs to get an Oregon license," McCabe added. "If he returns to Arizona and needs to get a duplicate Arizona license, I told him I would pay for it."
