The Anti-Klan/Anti-Nazi committee will sponsor a slide show on the past and present activities of the Ku Klux Klan; representatives of the Portland Anti-Klan Network, Seattle Anti-Klan Network, and National Anti-Klan Network will discuss their work in fighting right-wing, racist extremists.

Racist violence has been steadily rising in Oregon. Recent examples include a cross-burning in Milwaukie, vandalism of a Salem synagogue and harassment of Black families in St. Helens and Eugene.
