**Portland's rising star**

There is a star on the rise in Portland: a very beautiful and Black star. Rising out of the midst of tens of thousands with a voice that's reminiscent of the culture of the American Black: a mixture of many things.

Linda Hornbuckle, a 26-year-old native Portlander, the daughter of Reverend Howard Hornbuckle and a 1973 graduate of Grant High School, is the star in question, and the singing of modern-day music with a gospel twist is the mixture.

She said, "Now and then I like to go back to church to sing. It's the source. It's like going back there and regrouping, pulling it all together again."

Linda is one of the Hornbuckle's ten children and like many American Blacks she was raised in a religious atmosphere, in this instance singing in church. "My sisters and I sang in church—we traveled with my dad, him preaching and us singing," she said. "I try to set a mood by talking with the audience and judging what they would like to hear."

It is a judgment that captivates and transports Linda to another dimension as she belts, dances and claps her hands while closing her

eyes and letting the unadulterated soul weave its spell.

"I am not where I want to be as far as professional standards are concerned. I feel that I have a long way to go," she said.

"I am more of a popular singer—not too much of going with fads. I pretty much like jazz and the old standards. But, in this line of work you have to be able to do a lot of things."

Singing is Linda's way of releasing tension and the church is where she regroups.—"Pull it all together." "I think every singer—musician—has the dream of really making it, but, if I should put it down today, I've had fun with it."

Fun is bringing them into the Hi Hat in Southwest Portland where she is currently doing her thing with the singing and playing trio of Mike Klobas, drums; Dover Weinberg, keyboard; and Edward A. Snyder, guitar. And as a tribute to the noise she is making locally, Maryanne Mayfield the graceful hurricane, said, "I'd heard a lot about her and came to hear her myself."

Rise Black star and let your luminous rays bathe hundreds of thousands in the culture of the Black man: Black soul. Linda Hornbuckle, the rising star.
