

# Slideshow features women shipyard workers

The Northwest Women's History Project will hold the premiere of *Good Work, Sister!*, an oral history slide-tape show, at a special reunion of World War II women shipyard workers, on Saturday, January 9, 1982, at 3:30 p.m. Co-sponsored by the Project and Meier & Frank, the show will take place in the M&F Georgian Tea Room, 10th floor, 621 S.W. 5th Ave. The reunion is open to all women who worked in any of the six Portland-area shipyards during World War II.

*Good Work, Sister!* is a 20-minute show featuring period music, historical and current photographs, and taped excerpts from interviews with 40 area women who learned skilled trades not previously open to women. They tell their own stories about welding, operating cranes and heavy machinery, experiencing discrimination, earning higher wages than they had before, using company-subsidized childcare. They also describe what happened when their skills were no longer needed because the war ended.

The Northwest Women's History Project, producer of *Good Work, Sister!*, is a non-profit organization exploring aspects of women's lives in the Pacific northwest.

The public premiere will be held at the Oregon Historical Society's Beaver Auditorium, 1230 S.W. Park Avenue, on Saturday, January 16, 1982, at 2:00 p.m. The show is open to the public free of charge, and is co-sponsored by the Oregon Committee for the Humanities. Three other free public showings have been scheduled: on Thursday, January 21, at 7:00 p.m. in

the Forum, Erb Memorial Union, University of Oregon, Eugene; on Sunday, February 21, at 7:30 p.m., #1 Tech-Lab Building, Treasure Valley Community College, Ontario; and on Monday, February 22, at 7:00 p.m. at Eastern Oregon State College, La Grande.

## Hospitals close wings

Although Providence has not had staff layoffs since August, "we have had units closed and nursing staffs consolidated," Lang says. A unit is the same as a wing, and there are four wings per floor.

"We have lost 50-60 employees through attrition, and plan on closing two or three units for the next six to eight months," Lang says.

Elective (not essential) surgery is down as well, Lang explains, because "people are choosing not to have it done."

Providence's share of Medicare

and Medicaid patients is very high in comparison to other hospitals. Lang accounts for this by the hospital's location—in an area of large 65-plus population—and says 3% of total patients are covered by Medicaid and 48% by Medicare.

As the government clamps down on cash outflows for health care claims, more and more hospitals will either have to turn away non-paying patients, or absorb the loss, Providence is no exception.

"Next year, we will write off \$12 million in unreimbursable Medicare claims," Lang says. "The government allows less and less."
