## 20 IDEAS UNDER \$20 TO HELP YOU SAVE ENERGY AT HOME.

Even if you've already done many of the big expensive jobs to weatherize your house, there are still lots of inexpensive little jobs you can do to save even more money all year long.

3. Insulate hot water pipes with insulation. Cost: \$2.50 for 12 feet of rubber flex tubing and \$1.59 for 25 feet of insulation. Savings: Up to \$8 a year.

4. Fix a leaky bathroom faucet. Cost: 50¢ for 6 washers. Savings: Up to \$19 a year.

5. Fix a leaky kitchen faucet (washerless type). Cost: \$3. Savings: Up to \$19 a year.

6. Install low flow shower restrictor. Cost: \$5.50. Savings: About \$8 a year.

7. Wrap electric heating ducts with insulation. Cost: 40¢ per linear foot. Savings: \$40 to \$100 a year.

8. Replace furnace filters, clean and maintain. Cost: 70¢ per filter. Savings: Up to \$20 a year.

9. Lower your heating thermostat in winter and raise it in the summer. Cost: Free. Savings: \$12 to \$100 a year.

10. Install wall plug infiltration gaskets on exterior walls. Cost: \$1.50 for 10. Savings: \$4 to \$15 a year.

11. Weatherstrip and caulk around exterior doors. Cost: \$10. Savings: Up to \$8\* a year.

12. Weatherstrip windows. Cost: \$1.25 for 1 average double-hung window. Savings: \$4 to \$12\* a year.

13. Caulk around an exterior window frame. Cost: \$6. Savings: \$4 to \$12\* a year.

14. Caulk around holes

where pipes and wiring enter the house. Cost: \$6. Savings: \$4 to \$19 a year.

15. Change incandescent bulbs to fluorescent. Cost: \$17 for each fluorescent fixture. Savings: \$6 to \$14 a year.

16. Replace high wattage incandescent bulbs with lower wattage bulbs. Cost: \$1. Savings: \$1 to \$7 a year.

17. Use a warm water wash and a cold rinse in your washing machine. Cost: Free. Savings: \$13 to \$25 a year.

18. When shaving, fill your sink with hot water instead of letting the water run. Cost: Free.

19. Use your imagination. There are many little jobs all over your house that can save energy.

Don't get nicked by hot water costs when you're shaving. Fill up your sink with hot water, instead of letting the money you spend for hot water go down the drain.

Here's a list you can clip out and keep of some of those jobs and how much you can save by doing them.

If you need "how-to" instructions, we have a free booklet available at your local Pacific Power office.

1. Lower your water heater thermostat to 120°, 140° with a dishwasher. Cost: Free. Savings: \$8 to \$24 a year.

2. Wrap water heater with insulation. Cost: \$20. Savings: \$12 to \$18 a year.
