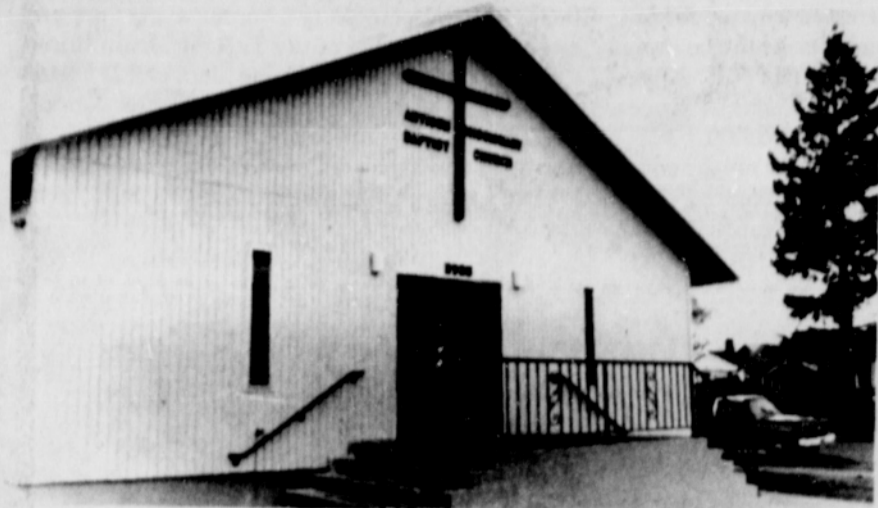


Antioch Baptist Church moves

Family history revealed

"From There To Here" is the program title for '82, to be presented at Sharon SDA Church, 22nd at NE Sumner St., Portland, February 27, 1982, 4 pm.

The program will consist of a mini-concert by The Sharonettes and guest musician Mr. Calvin Aloman. They will sing gospels and Negro spirituals, blending into the theme of the program. The speaker of the hour will be Mrs. Ann Johnson of Cleveland, Ohio, now residing in the Portland area, whose family possesses possibly the best documentation of family history of anyone in the Portland area. Mrs. Johnson will show slides of rare documents seldom seen even in history books: such as a slave contract purchasing the freedom of a Black man and his wife, a U.S. patent and all related documents filed by a family member near the turn of the century, and more.

The vestibule will house an exhibition of photographs, paintings, poetry, manuscripts and other forms of art done by members of the church. A special attraction will be a display of African artifacts.

The public is invited.

A.P.R.I. President speaks at Reed

Norman Hill, president of the A. Phillip Randolph Institute headquartered in New York City, will be in Portland on Monday, March 1. Hill will come to this city to make a free public address at Reed College that evening at 8 pm. He was invited to the Reed campus by a body of Reed students called "Students for Solidarity." His subject is to be "Reagan's Attack on Minorities."

Since his graduation from Haverford College with a B.A. in Sociology in 1956, Mr. Hill has been

known as a civil rights activist attached to such movements as the Chicago Area Negro American Labor Council, the Chicago wade-ins which integrated Rainbow Beach and the youth march for integrated schools. Later, joining the staff of CORE, Hill became its National Program Director from 1961 to 1964.

Hill helped to coordinate Dr. Martin Luther King's six-city 1964 he lobbied to get-out-the-vote tour; he lobbied to increase the minimum

wage and was in the labor delegation on the Selma-Montgomery march against racial discrimination in voting in the deep South. He was Associate Director of the A. Philip Randolph Institute, helping to coordinate the Memphis march at the time of Dr. King's assassination in 1968. Mr. Hill became Executive Director of the Randolph Institute in 1975 and President in 1980.

The Reed College lecture is to be held in Room 314 of Eliot Hall.

Last year I published the following areas of IMPORTANT MUSTS, and their relationship with each other as a philosophical success formula.

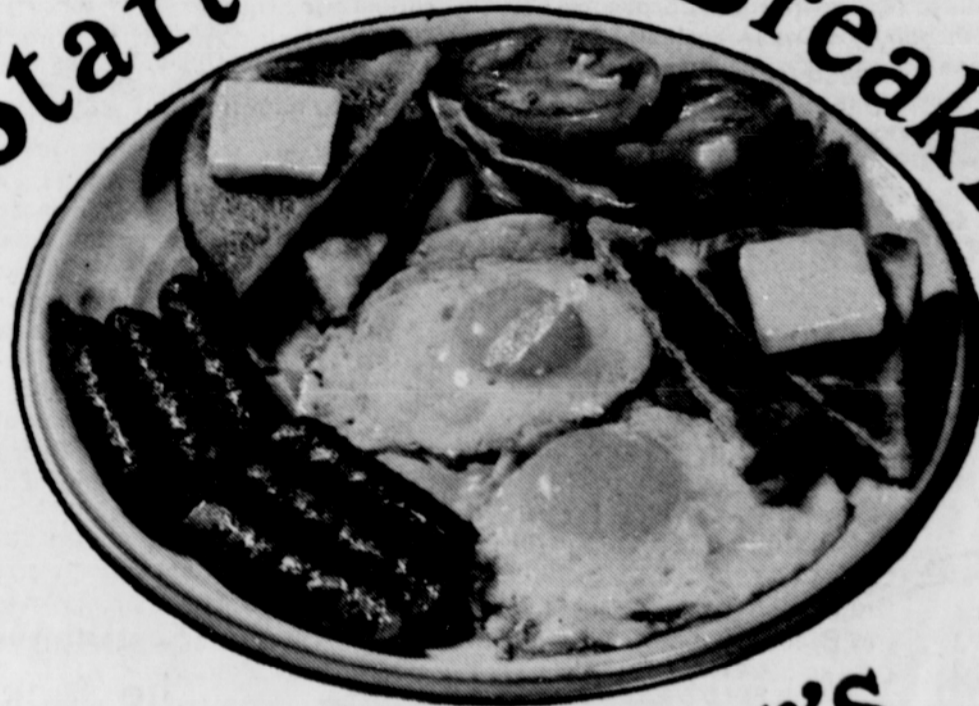
Now, here they are again, this time viewed as "Quadripartite Mental -Fitness" objective criteria.
