Jazz concert at Jefferson

A jazz and tap concert starring veteran tap tancer Honi Coles and his colleague Brenda Bufalino, will be presented Saturday, March 13 at 8:15 pm in the Jefferson Performing Arts Center, 5210 North Kerby Avenue.

The legendary Honi Coles has been performing for fifty years in clubs and concert halls throughout the country and is well remembered as part of the great class act, "Coles and Atkins." Today, he is still dancing as the leader of the famed Copasetics and has starred on Broadway in "Bubblin" Brown Sugar."

Honi's current dancing partner, Brenda Bufalino, has been called the "epitome of energy." She is a performer, choreographer, dance historian and instructor and has appeared on television and on stages across the nation and abroad. 


