Billy Ray Bates, super-sub of the Portland Trailblazers, was voted National Basketball Association player of the week for the period ending April 11.

Bates is the second Trailblazer to win the award this season. Mychal Thompson was named as the week's top player back in the first week of the season.

The Washington Redskins have signed quarterback Joe Theismann to a \$1.5 million, four-year contract. That amount will make him the highest-paid player in the team's history by the time he enters the last year of the contract.

Undefeated Michael Spinks knocked out Murray Sutherland in the eighth round to retain his World Boxing Association light-heavyweight championship in Atlantic City, N.J.

Spinks, 25, has 14 knockouts in his 20 pro fights.

Oregon State's Lester Conner was named to the all-tournament team after the last game of the 14th annual aloha Classic basketball tournament played in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Pete Rose, the all-time National League hit leader with 3,700, signed a new contract Monday with the Philadelphia Phillies estimated to be worth more than \$1 million a year.

Rose is 491 hits short of Ty Cobb's all-time major league record of 4,191.

is needed. She supported Union Avenue redevelopment and the new PDC economic development plan. "I do not approve of HCD (Housing and Community Development) money going to Pioneer Square." She also opposed many facets of the new city office building for financial reasons.

Money should be spent on job training. "I supported Charles on training programs. We should not allow the programs to go away because the money is lost."

**Police:** Commissioner Schwab announced that she supported the Storrs' Committee's recommended police audit committee and proposed a resolution to create a committee of two council members and volunteers. A resolution, unlike an ordinance, could not be changed

by initiative petition — an effort the police union is now making. Jordan had submitted a similar ordinance. "I gave Charles a letter that morning outlining the specific changes that we would have to agree to if I were to support his ordinance." Jordan did not agree to delete the names of police officers or complainants in investigations made public. "I could not vote for the ordinance because it would open us up to suits. The reason we are in the financial situation we are in is because of the suits and settlements and I could not open us up to more."

**Housing:** Housing rehabilitation is in Margaret Strachan's bureau and she is doing a good job. The City needs to put in money to keep landlords from allowing housing to deteriorate. Slum landlords should be "sent back where they come from."

**Schools:** Schools are not a City responsibility. "I'm only sorry that we can't do anything about it." (the current conflict between the school board and the black community). The situation that Dr. Prophet is facing is "hard enough without our second guessing him." She added that if Prophet is willing to go with the Boise site the Council should not undermine his position. "It's too bad the board doesn't listen to the community. I have great respect for Prophet and I wouldn't do anything to hurt him."

**The Council:** "Elected boards are not accountable to the people, I have to concede that."
