Saturday, May 22 at 8 pm, the 1972 team which took the state AAA basketball title will return to face the 1978 team which finished third in the state tourney.

The game, a fund raiser for the Daryl LaGrone Memorial Scholarship Fund, will feature half-time entertainment, music provided by Jeff's award winning music program, and a contest between brothers. The winner of the LaGrone Scholarship will be announced at half time. Admission is \$2, and tickets are available at the door.

Brotherly love will be tested as Phil Hopson, an all-city choice in '78 and more recently familiar to sports fans as an NCAA star on the Idaho Vandals squad, squares off against his brother Tony, an all-tourney selection in '72. The Redeau brothers, Charles ('78) and Albert ('72), will also compete against each other as well as Don ('72) and Howard ('78) Jenkins.

Several other JHS alums will join the brother duos. Nearly all the '72 team coached by Jack Bertell be here for the game. They include the starting five:

Ray Leary: finished at San Diego State after playing varsity for two years. He is currently working at Tubman Middle School.

Carl Bird: after two years at Arizona Western, Carl finished at the University of California, Berkeley, then played overseas in Italy and the Philippines. He is presently working for an insurance company in San Francisco.

Charles Channel: went to Portland State University, then to the University of Hawaii-Hilo. He is presently working in Portland.

Ronnie Cole: played for University of San Diego, then spent a year with the Globetrotters. He is presently working as an agent for professional athletes in Los Angeles.

Tony Hopson: after playing at Mt. Hood Community College, he finished at Willamette University. In 1977 Tony participated in the Trailblazer rookie camp. Currently, he is teaching at Lincoln High School here in Portland where he is also the head women's basketball coach.

Phil Lathan, Finley Hammond, Albert Redeau, Greg Brown, Mike McKinney, Gerald Deloney, Rick Whitlow, and Donald Jenkins will also play in the Game of Champs.

Phil Hopson will lead his '78 Jefferson teammates. Coached by Bobby Harris these Demos took third in the state tourney after losing to Parkrose in the semi-finals. The starters include:

Phil Hopson: returns to the University of Idaho this fall to finish his fourth year with the Vandals. This past season he was second in the nation in field goal percentage and was

named to the all-league team.

Ron Ranson: played at Los Angeles Southwest, then returned to Oregon to play for Chemeketa Community College. He is now attending Portland State University.

Don Ranson: went to Everett Community College in Everett, Washington, then transferred to Lane Community College in Oakland, California. He currently lives in Portland.

Virgil Allen: after playing at Walla Walla Community College for a year, Virgil played at Mt. Hood Community College. He is now finishing his degree in communications at Oregon State University.

Charles Redeau: played at Walla Walla Community College for a year, then at Clackamas Community College for a year. He now attends Eastern Oregon State College in LaGrande where he is playing football.

Brian Hughes: attended the University of Washington for two years where he was an honor roll student, then transferred to Pepperdine where he is completing his studies.

In addition, Bruce Jones, Howard Jenkins, Howard Hornbuckle, and Charles Fair will also be suited up in the blue and gold.

According to Tony Hopson, reunion organizer, this is just one in a series of events leading to the ten-year reunion planned for the Class of '72. July 31 and August 1 the class will hold a two-day celebration at The Cosmopolitan Air Tel. For more information you can call 226-3483. Faye Sono, yearbook editor in '72, is coordinating publicity.
