Notice is hereby given that upon request by any interested person a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at the Water Service Building Auditorium, 1800 S.W. Sixth Avenue, Portland, Oregon, at 10:00 a.m., Monday, June 28, 1982, for the purpose of considering a project for which federal operating assistance under Section 5 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, is being sought. Anyone interested in requesting that this hearing be convened should contact Cynthia Weston, Planning & Development Division, by phone, 238-4920 or in writing, 4012 S.E. 17th Avenue, Portland, Oregon, 97202 by June 11, 1982.

This project is generally described as follows:

Section 5 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, provides federal operating assistance to Urban Mass Transportation Systems, whereby the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) is eligible to receive federal funds for operating assistance for fiscal year 1982-83. The federal funds available are expected to be \$3,887,000. The total net project cost is \$48,287,000 of which the local share is \$44,400,000 to be provided through payroll tax, self-employment tax and advertising revenues.

The project is to consist of transportation services provided by Tri-Met for the counties of Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington. Special needs of the elderly and handicapped are addressed in the grant application. No persons, families, or businesses will be displaced by this project. The project will have no significant environmental impact upon the service area. The project is in conformance with comprehensive land use and transportation planning in the area and is consistent with the adopted programming of projects in the transportation improvement program.

At the hearing Tri-Met will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic and environmental aspects of the project. Interested persons may submit oral or written evidence and recommendations with respect to the project.

A copy of the application for federal grant for the project is available for public inspection at the Tri-Met office, Planning & Development Department, 4012 S.E. 17th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

US supports wrong side

cent in major urban areas, and Western Europe's economic downturn has displaced Moroccan "guest workers" there. The nation has a mounting balance of payments deficit (estimated at \$1.8 billion in 1980), and growing public debt (40.3 per cent of GNP in 1980).

In addition, international pressure is being-brought on the regime to account for its treatment of political prisoners. Amnesty International reported May 19 that some 90 people have disappeared since 1975 after reportedly being picked up by security police in connection with the war in the Western Sahara.

All these ills are compounded by Moroccan losses in the Western Sahara since the occupation began in 1975. Congressional experts estimate the war is costing Morocco about \$1.9 billion each year, or over \$5 million a day.

Over 80,000 Moroccan troops now control little more than the northern tenth of the Western Sahara, called the "useful triangle" because it contains most Saharan cities and massive phosphate deposits. They are entrenched behind a 280-mile mud wall, reinforced with U.S.-made electronic sensors. Sometimes dubbed "the Great Wall of the Sahara," it has not halted Polisario actions against and behind Moroccan front lines. During the battles at Gueltazemmour in October, 1981, five Moroccan aircraft were shot down.

The Reagan Administration claims that Libya and the U.S.S.R. are supplying arms to the Polisario Front. The Administration fears an independent Sahara would be leftist

and hostile to U.S. policy objectives in the area.

Supporters of aid to Morocco argue that it would bolster a long-time ally which helped bring about the Camp David accords. They often refer to the "Moderate Moroccans" as a bulwark against "Arab extremism."

Opponents, led by Rep. Stephen Solarz (D-NY), feel such aid would make the king less likely to negotiate a peaceful settlement of the conflict and would destabilize his own regime as the militarily unwinnable war drags on.

The Administration, in an early departure from President Carter's ambivalence on the issue, moved quickly to supply arms requested by Morocco. Haig, in one of his first official acts as Secretary of State, approved the sale of 108 M-60 tanks to Morocco as well as the scheduled delivery of six OB-10 reconnaissance planes and 20 F-5E fighter jets. In March, 1981, the Administration announced it would no longer link Moroccan arms sales to progress toward a negotiated settlement. A 23-man team of military and State Department experts visited Morocco and Western Sahara in November, provoking an OAU protest.

In February, Haig visited Morocco to sign an agreement setting up a Joint Military Commission. He and other Administration officials are negotiating for overflight rights for the Rapid Deployment Force and use of former U.S. military bases for refueling. The United States evacuated its military bases in Morocco in 1978, ending a 36-year military presence.
