New Argentine economy?

toward greater nationalistic, anti-Western economic policies. No politician or military commander could afford to move back toward social, economic or cultural dependence on Britain or the United States.

From the perspective of the political and economic elite of Argentina, the actions by the Western bankers in the weeks following a possible Argentine defeat will be crucial. Argentina has an external debt of \$34 billion, of which about \$17 billion is owed to British banks. The country owes \$9 billion to U.S. banking institutions. Debt payment has continued to grow over the years with interest alone amounting to \$2.5 billion for 1982. The total amount that Argentina is supposed to come up with for this year is no less than \$11 billion. Yet its dollar

reserves are just \$3.6 billion. About 67 cents out of every dollar that Argentina earns from its exports have to be used to pay interest on its external debt.

With a reduction of exports to the European community—about 25 percent of export earnings—the situation is even more critical. And no one knows for sure what has been the direct cost of the war or what longterm effect it will have on the whole economy.

Since April, European banks have frozen their loans to Argentina. European lenders are fearful of what may happen in Argentina and they do not want to take chances. There even has been serious talk recently of increasing interest rates on loans to Argentina. Yet they do not want to foreclose on their loans, either. That could create a major financial crisis.

If, following an Argentine defeat, international bankers show themselves willing to renegotiate the loans on generous terms, then there is reason to believe that Argentina could happen if the tide of popular nationalism and anti-British sentiment were defused sufficiently to allow dealing with major Western economies. And that sentiment, in turn, depends on whether Argentina is humiliated in a crashing and absolute defeat, or allowed to save face through a compromise on the islands which eventually would resolve the issue of sovereignty in their favor.

Whether the Western powers will recognize the situation and try to avoid it remains to be seen. If they do not, the end of the war in the islands may well be the beginning of even more serious problems on a world scale.
