World Cup Soccer update

The first round of World Cup Soccer is over and the second round has begun.

Nearly all of our first round predictions were correct, so we are ready to speculate on the second round.

Group I - Poland, with 4 points, and Italy, with 3, won the right to represent Group I in the second round. Cameroon did better than expected, with our without the help of the witch doctor they brought along with the team. Peru, which had problems gathering its players from throughout the world, made a poor showing.

Group II - The Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany) recovered from a bad start to defeat Chile. Then the former champions took a 1-0 must-win from Austria to slip into the second round. The West German win resulted in a three way tie with Austria, FRG and Algeria, but the points won vs points yielded formula gave the births to FRG and Austria.

Algeria had beaten the Germans 2-1 and pulled a stunning upset over Chile 3-2. Algeria, which would have been the first African team to make the second round, has called for the disqualification of West Germany and Austria for lack of sportsmanship in "lack of ambition and fighting spirit" in the final game. Although West Germany needed a win to gain the second round, Austria could have lost two or three goals and still held second place in the group - hence the charge of lack-luster play (or was it collusion?).

Group III - Belgium surprised both Argentina and Hungary to take first place in this group. After an embarrassing first game loss to

Belgium. Argentina placed second the group. Hungary, which we had given the edge over Belgium, came in third. El Salvador, which along with Honduras, represented Central and North America, made no points and distinguished itself with the greatest loss - 10 to 0.

Group IV - England was the solid leader with 6; France was second with 3. England gained the reputation of the roughest spectators and showed unsportsmanlike behavior in its treatment of Argentina.

Group V - Spain and Northern Ireland will represent this group. The host Spain, although not an outstanding team, went all out for a good showing.

Group IV - Brazil, the favorite, came in first with 6 points. Scotland made a good showing. After a loss to Brazil and a win over New Zealand, Scotland needed a win over the USSR to reach the second round. Over 30,000 spectators watched in Malagar, Spain as Scotland took the lead in the first half but eventually lost to a strong Soviet team. The USSR and Brazil lead Group VI.

The 24 teams have been pared to 12, which are now divided into four groups: A, B, C, and D.

Our predictions for round two are:

- Group A: Poland
- Group B: West Germany
- Group C: Brazil
- Group D: France

Watch for the USSR and Poland, but our favorites are still Brazil, West Germany and Argentina.

Argentina's chance of a repeat championship has all but ended with a 2-1 defeat by Italy Tuesday. The Argentines must meet Brazil Friday and can only gain the semi-finals if Italy upsets Brazil.

Mrs. Atiyeh heads Scott games

Dolores Hewitt Atiyeh, wife of Gov. Victor Atiyeh, has been named Chieftain of the day for Portland's 30th anniversary Highland Games & Clan Gathering July 16, 17 & 18 at David Douglas High School, Portland.

She is the first woman to hold the title, according to Dixie McKendrick, Lake Oswego, president of the Portland Highland Games Association.

The Scottish ancestors of Oregon's first lady came to Florida, Georgia and the Carolinas before

the American Revolution; the names MacDonnell and MacDonal, O'Neal, Chisholm, Fraser and Drummond crowd the family tree. They came from the Isle of Skye, from Inverness, from Glengarry, from Balindon. Family records indicate kinship with Flora MacDonal, the Scottish heroine who was imprisoned in the Tower of London because she helped the Young Pretender escape after the battle at Culloden; she later emigrated to North Carolina.

As Chieftain of the 1982 Highland Games & Clan Gathering, Mrs. Atiyeh's duties will include awarding prizes and trophies. Among the trophies will be the coveted Inverness Challenge Shield, donated by the people of Inverness, Scotland—the city from which, more than 200 years ago, one of Dolores Atiyeh's ancestors came to America.

Black officials in pro sports

There are seventeen black officials in professional sports today.

Toler became the first black official in professional sports when he was hired by the National Football League (NFL) in 1965. Now 11 of the NFL referees are black. There are only five blacks out of the National Basketball Association's (NBA) 29 referees. Baseball has just one black umpire, the third black official in that game's history.

The NFL referees are the only pro sports officials with a relatively light schedule (4 pre-season and 16 regular games as opposed to the 82 games of NBA referees). The NFL referees extra time gives them a chance to pursue careers that range from high-ranking university officials to high school principals to law enforcement officers.
