Exodus Presents Bamm In Concert

In my role as a Commissioner working with local agencies, one outstanding program came to my attention. Although there were not sufficient funds to provide for this service through the County, I felt that something had to be done to make it available. The service is one proposed by Tom and Rosalie Booth, who direct the House of Exodus, an excellent social service agency in the Albina neighborhood. Mr. and Mrs. Booth have proposed to work with youth that most agencies consider to be unemployable. They want to put these young people to work in their own neighborhoods providing services to the elderly. This project is exciting because it deals with a population that we often cannot serve and it helps that population to feel that they belong in and contribute to the neighborhood that they live in. As this service is so important, I have undertaken an effort to raise funds privately for this proposed program.

It is my pleasure to announce that two excellent groups of performers have agreed to assist the House of Exodus Youth Employment Program by performing in a benefit concert. Obo Addy and his jazz group, Kukrudu, will be performing with the comedy group, Bamm, on August 25th, at the Jefferson High School Auditorium.

Public Schools; all four commercial television stations, as well as several radio stations in the metropolitan

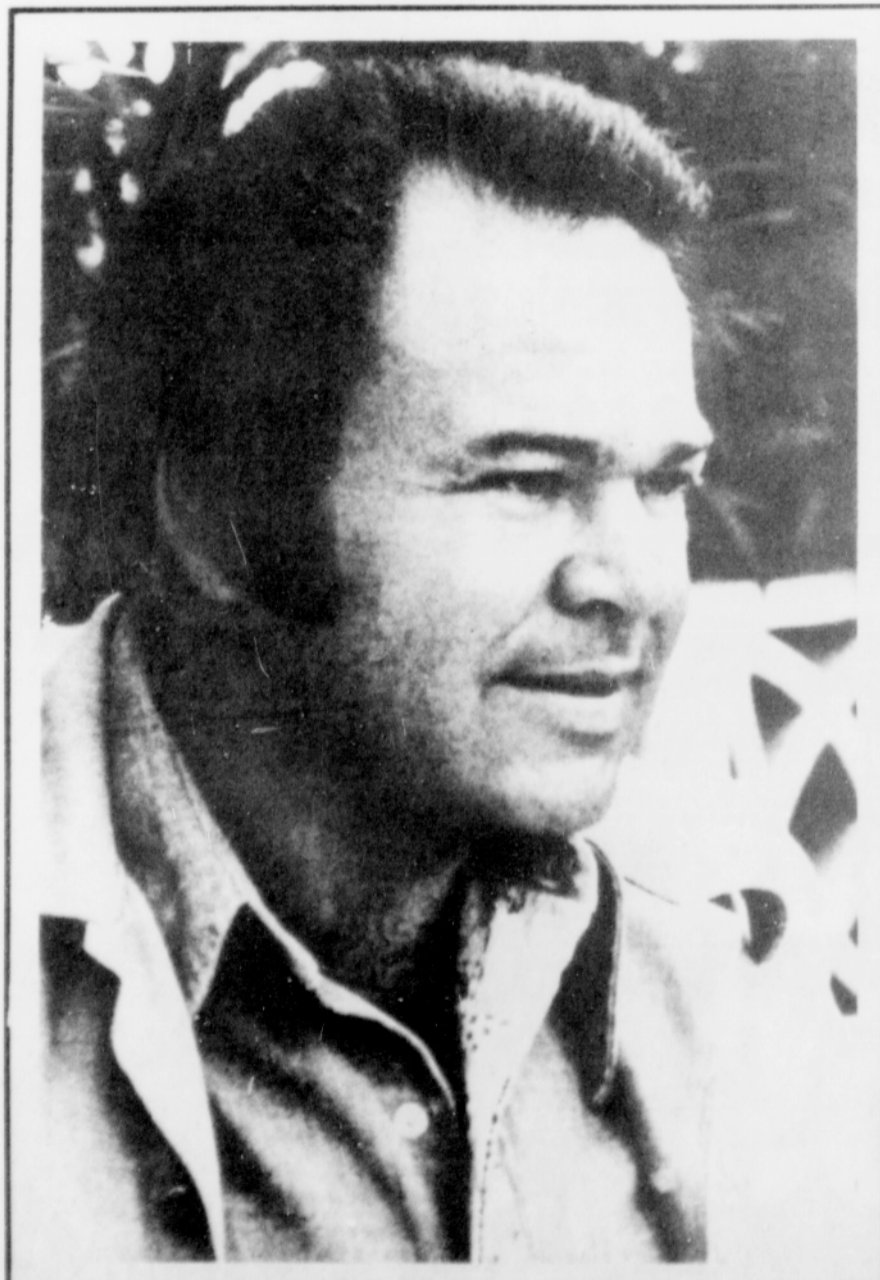
area, and Vicki Rubstein of Celebrity Attractions, who has agreed to handle ticket sales for this event.

Roy Clark Down At The Fair

Kicking off the line-up of entertainers at the 1982 Lane County Fair is Roy Clark. A "versatented" entertainer, Clark is a talented guitarist, banjoist, vocalist, comedian and actor.

His first hit, "The Tips of My Fingers" gave evidence that he knows what to do with a ballad, and this continued with his recording of another well-known ballad, "Yesterday When I Was Young." His 1982 album release is "Live From Austin City Limits."

In addition to his well-known country/ballads, Clark can be seen weekly on the TV show "Hee-Haw" which he co-hosts with Buck Owens. Hee-Haw is referred to as the country and western "Laugh-In," with a ninety per cent comedy format.

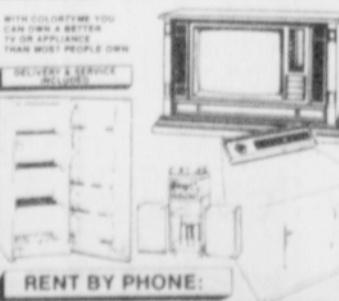
