'Dark Shadows' returns

"Dark Shadows", the drama of eerie suspense and murder, is being brought back to life by KATU in Portland. The program is scheduled to premiere September 6th, and will air Monday through Friday following ABC late-night programming on Channel Two.

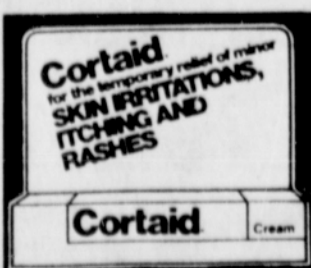
"Dark Shadows" is television's only series that follows in the tradition of the classic Gothic suspense novel. The setting is a small fishing village, hidden in the cliffs of the rugged Maine seacoast. Collinwood, the brooding family mansion, is a home of dark mysteries and intrigue. Within its halls stalk tormented residents of the estate . . . ghosts, witches, werewolves . . . held captive by spells reaching out from the depths of time.

The program shifts in time from the 20th to the 18th century and tells the bizarre story of the Collins family ancestors. With this shift in time, many of the stars are seen in dual rolls.

The series stars Jonathan Frid as Barnabas Collins, the 175-year-old resident vampire; Joan Bennett as Elizabeth Collins Stoddard and Naomi Collins; Alexandra Moltke as Victoria Winters and a suspected witch; Louis Edmonds as Roger Collins and Joshua Collins; Nancy Barrett as Carolyn Stoddard and Millicent Collins; and Grayson Hall as Dr. Julia Hoffman and Natalie.

"Dark Shadows" originally premiered on ABC Television in 1968 and was on the air for five years. The series was one of the highest rated in the history of daytime television.
