The national jobless rate remained unchanged in February. The number of persons holding jobs fell by 180,000.

The length of the average workweek decreased from 35.1 hours to 34.4 hours. Shorter work-weeks were recorded in manufacturing, wholesale-retail trade, and services. Of the 11.5 million unemployed in February, half were adult men, 34 percent were adult women, 16 percent were teenagers.

(Continued from page 1 column 6) of Rainier Bank and Leasing and a leader of the Jackson Education Coalition ("usually their spokesman," he said), is running against Jim Ashbough, a geography professor at PSU for 26 years, who is adamantly opposed to the Jackson or any other

Dooling has been involved in the Jackson Coalition from the start, but said he doesn't want to use the ESD Board position as a platform to advance the secession movement. "That's all history," as far as the Board is concerned, he said.

Dooling said he has no predisposed position regarding another threatened secession. "It's necessary to review all the facts," he said.

The Board cannot legally jeopardize the public interest by allowing an area to secede that would threaten the remaining district tax base, he said, which is something those who fear the withdrawal of the west side don't take into consideration.

His experience includes co-chairmanship of the Wilson Advisory Committee, member of the Portland Desegregation Commission Steering Committee, and chairman of the desegregation committee for Jackson. Dooling felt he had "some familiarity and experience with desegregation" and that Jackson had a "model program" where the 20 percent of students bussed from other parts of the city were

very involved in all school programs. "I want that very much to continue when we have our own district," he said.

Ashbaugh said he jumped into the race against Dooling at the last moment "to give the voters a choice." He has joined the Portland School District in their fight to have the Jackson secession put to a districtwide vote, and if elected to the ESD Board, "I would not vote for any more independent school districts,'

"I think that the next term [on the Board] is going to be a very important one if the Jackson secession goes ahead and other schools try and follow," he said. The result could be the dismantling of the Portland School District, he said, something he wants very much to avoid.

Schools deserve more money, not less, he said. "I'm not a budget cutter, quite the contrary." Ashbaugh said he would like to take a "hard look" at the ESL program, however. "I've never felt that teaching English as a second language was that important of a program," he said, and suggested that money saved on ESL "would be more than enough to keep Jackson open on an ongoing basis.'

Also running for Position are Bob Goldstein, a retired Brooklyn entertainer and "perennial candidate," and William Grenfell, ex-State Legislator and current member of the Portland Community College Board, who is also running for the Portland School Board.


