School desegregation

(Continued from page 1 column 6) not to the same degree as blacks. Another ironic mockery of the American promise of equality of education opportunity as a foundation of democracy and as an indispensable vehicle toward economic mobility is found in a repeated demonstration of the fact that academic achievement of students varies directly with their family income. Poor white children who are required to attend inferior public schools are also consistently academically retarded. What is not stated in this report or any other report known to this writer is that the more privileged white children who have the highest S.A.T. scores may not be academically retarded, but may be suffering from an equally important educational deficit or moral retardation imposed upon them by an insensitive school and educational system.

It is my personal opinion that we cannot expect to make much more progress in the desegregation of our schools by continuing to place the emphasis on how cruel and unjust it is to blacks.

Just before he died Albert Einstein said that with the Nuclear Age everything had changed, except our way of thinking and acting. I think one of the things that Reagan has done for me, is to make me understand that those of us who are concerned with the quest for justice and decency in the United States must somehow change our strategies

and our emphasis. We must find ways of communicating to the critical mass, if not the majority of the American people, that continued practices in American racism threaten the stability of the entire society. We must find ways to get the American people — middle Americans, blue-collar Americans who are suffering from government-imposed insensitivity and rejection as much as are blacks — to understand that racism and rejection is contagious; that what is done to blacks with impunity can also be done to others with impunity. This is specifically apparent in regard to the struggle for more democratic and effective schools. We must develop a strategy for communicating to the majority of American whites something they are reluctant to understand and accept: that segregated, racially organized schools damage their children, make their children incapable of coping with a real world in which two-thirds of the people are not white; that America has a precious commodity in its racially diverse population which can be used as a very positive asset in education.

The preceding is from an address to the Legal Defense Fund by Dr. Kenneth B. Clark, Sociologist Kenneth B. Clark spearheaded psychosocial research leading to civil rights reform in education. His research was cited by the Supreme Court in its 1954 Brown v. Board of Education ruling that outlawed public school segregation.
