City, state honor Salvation Army

Oregon Governor Victor Atiyeh and Portland Mayor Frank Ivancie this week signed documents congratulating The Salvation Army for 100 years of service in the Western United States. (Continued from page 1 column 6) cations in each of the following groups: city and county officials, organized labor, investment finance, economic development, non-profit or cooperative business, small business and a low income area resident appointed by community action organizations. The original bill called for a person with an income below the median in a low-income area to be a member of the nine member board. The CDFC board is said to be more "user oriented" than the state's Economic Development Commission.

The future of the CDFC remains cloudy for both political and economic reasons. The imminent default of the Washington Public Power Supply System will seriously affect the entire municipal bond market according to Freda

Efforts to give additional financing capability to the CDFC may stall HB 2002 if proposed as an amendment. Such financing might include venture capital for high-tech oriented efforts, also to be paid for by bond sale proceeds. Additionally, CDFC cannot be empowered without its enabling legislation HJR 27 first being approved by Oregonians through the referral process.

Business Notes

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped from 11 percent in March to 10.4 percent in April, according to a report released last week by the Oregon Employment Division. Total employment went up 19,800 over the month while the number of job seekers declined by 12,900. Unemployment for the nation also dipped but only slightly, from 10.3 percent in March to 10.2 percent for April.

Academic studies have shown that **employee-owned companies are more profitable and productive than conventional businesses**, but from the National Center for Employee Ownership comes the news that **they create more jobs as well**. From 1973 to 1982, the study found, employment at worker-owned companies grew by 3.9 percent, more than three times the rate of increase at conventional firms.

The **Home Ownership Incentive Act of 1983**, introduced by Oregon Congressman Les AuCoin and Reps. Beryl Anthony (D-Ark.) and Bill Frenzel (R-Minn.), would establish an Individual Housing Account. Under an Individual Housing Account, annual tax-deductible contributions up to \$1,000 (individual) and \$2,000 (joint) could be made for the purchase of a home. A maximum of \$10,000 could be accumulated in this way.

AuCoin said the IHA concept would work like the highly successful Individual Retirement Account. He said it would enable as many as 3 million families to become home owners — boosting demand for timber and creating jobs in the housing industry.

Under the **Small Business Innovation Development Act** federal agencies with sizeable research and development budgets must award a fixed, minimum percentage of their funds to small firms. The Small Business Administration estimates that up to \$45 million will be awarded in fiscal 1983 under this program. That amount is expected to increase tenfold by fiscal 1987.

The Bonneville Power Administration's new rate proposal calls for an **increase of 27 percent** over the next two years for priority firm customers. Priority firms buy power wholesale for resale to residential and farm customers. The impact on retail rates is not yet known. The rate proposal is subject to public comment and review.

Portland's Freightliner Corp. announced Monday the beginning of production on a **226 truck order** for Ryder/P.I.E. Nationwide of Jacksonville, Fla. Based on current truck prices, the value of the order is in the range of \$10 million to \$15 million.

Eastern Airlines employees may soon own a large chunk of the company under an Investment Bonus Agreement. Non-union and management employees were asked Monday to join members of the International Association of Machinists and the Air Line Pilots Association in accepting a stock and profit-sharing program. Eastern Chairman Frank Borman has said a group of banks want to know the unions and employees overall are cooperating with the ailing airline.
