Ms. Beldon is an interdenominational Bible teacher in Portland. She is heard Monday through Friday over KPQD-FM 93.7 at 1:15 p.m. She has ministered all over the Southwest through singing and speaking and has also served as president and vice-president of a women's ministry at her church. ## Business Notes

The Oregon State Department of General Services, Purchasing Division is sponsoring a seminar for minority manufacturer/supplier firms on Wednesday, June 1, 1983, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. The seminar will be held at 1225 Ferry Street S.E., Salem, Oregon in the Department of General Services Conference Room.

The seminar is designed to familiarize minority business firms with the State of Oregon Purchasing Policies and specifically to provide information on the goals, policy and operation of the Minority Business Enterprise Program.

"Profit-sharing — to me that's the ultimate way for employees to get their wages increased," declared Roger B. Smith, chairman of the board of General Motors last Friday. GM will offer profit-sharing to the United Auto Workers in 1984 contract negotiations as its response to union sentiment for a share of the company's recent growth. The union made concessions in the last round of bargaining because of a deficit at GM.

Local project sponsors in Oregon are being invited to apply to share in approximately \$310,000 worth of federal Jobs Bill Act money for landscaping projects on public grounds. The funds are being administered by the State Parks Division, which will serve as a "pipeline" for the Small Business Administration allocation.

Project sponsors can include cities, counties, park and recreation districts, and Indian tribes. The deadline for submission of applications is June 10. The federal money carries stipulations requiring that contracts for work and for purchase of supplies can go only to firms which qualify as "small" businesses under terms of the federal Small Business Act.

The Producer Price Index for Finished Goods moved down 0.1 percent from March to April on a seasonally adjusted basis, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. This followed an identical decline in March and a 0.1 percent rise in February. Prices for intermediate goods decreased 0.2 percent, after falling 0.7 percent in March and 0.1 percent in February. On the other hand, crude material prices advanced 1.4 percent, more than twice as much as in either of the 2 preceding months.

Freedom National Bank of New York, the nation's largest black-owned and managed bank reports its sixth consecutive year of profitability and fourth consecutive year of cash dividend disbursements to shareholders. Net per-tax income amounted to \$960,791 in 1982 as compared to 1981's record high pre-tax earnings of \$1,366,786. Despite the decline in earnings, the bank's year-end assets were \$99,226,635, with daily assets growing 33% to a year-end average of \$105,186,300.

The Howard Inn, Washington, D.C.'s only black-owned and operated hotel will be the site of the National Association of Minority Contractors' (NAMC) 14th Annual Convention. Rallying under this year's theme, "Building Bridges... Crossing Barriers," the more than 500 expected conferees will chart a new course for minorities in the construction industry at the four-day event beginning on June 22.

## Employers receive tax break

 Disadvantaged youth have a new weapon in the war against unemployment as a result of the Tax Equity and Financial Responsibility Act of 1982. Disadvantaged youth who obtain a voucher of their qualifications under the Targeted Jobs Tax Credit Program (TJTC) can tell potential employers that 90 days of their labor will only cost \$262 under the program.

Hired disadvantaged youth, who must be 16- or 17-year-olds, will receive at least the federal minimum wage of \$3.35 an hour, but the net cost to the employer can be as little as 50 cents an hour. For example, an employer can pay each youth hired under the program the minimum wage for up to 90 days and claim 85 percent of the amount as a credit deducted from the firm's tax return.

To qualify, the youth must be 16 or 17 years old on the hiring date and from a family whose total income the previous 12 months did not exceed the poverty level. Vouchers can be obtained from the State of Oregon Job Service.

Disadvantaged youth recently joined eight other target groups as eligible employees under the TJTC program. Tax credits for these other target groups are based upon 50 percent of the first year wages up to \$6,000 (or a maximum of \$3,000) and 25 percent of second year wages up to \$6,000 (maximum \$1,500) for each eligible employee.

The other eight target groups are: (1) Social Security Income recipients; (2) Handicapped individuals referred from Vocational Rehabilitation; (3) Youth, 18 through 24, from low income families; (4) Vietnam-era veterans whose families are low income; (5) General assistance (state or locally financed welfare) for 30 or more days; (6) Youth, 16 through 19, participating in an approved cooperative education program; (7) Ex-convicts with low income families hired within five years of release from prison or date of conviction, whichever is later; and (8) AFDC recipients and WIN (JOBS Program) enrollees.

On or before the day eligible employees begin work, the employer must request in writing that the person be certified for TJTC, and mail the request to the nearest Employment Division local office, or to TJTC, 875 Union St. N.E., Salem, OR 97311. Employees must give their vouchers to employers who complete it and mail it to the address above. Employers then receive an Employer Certification authorizing them to receive federal tax credits.
