HB 2737 aids small business development

Oregon's small businesses would get a financial boost under a new state law passed by the House of Representatives Tuesday, June 20, Representative Donna Zajonc announced. HB 2737, passed by a 49-1 vote, would create an "umbrella"

program to extend the current state industrial development revenue bond program to smaller businesses. The problem with the current industrial bond program — in which the state issues tax-free bonds for economic development projects —

is that it has been too expensive to allow small businesses to participate. The new program, if enacted, would allow the Economic Development Department to package the bonds of several small businesses into a single "umbrella" issue. Small businesses will then be able to get low fixed rate long term credit to finance new investments.

small businesses around the state to finance new, or expand existing, buildings, machinery and other similar investments. Projects as large as \$1 million are eligible, but most bonds should be in the \$100,000 to \$500,000 range.

UC extended benefits end

The extended benefits unemployment insurance program will terminate in Oregon with claims for the week ending July 2, 1983, according to an announcement made today by the Oregon Employment Division. Federal law provides for this 13 week extension during periods of high unemployment. Because of Oregon's improving economy the insured unemployment rate has fallen below the federally mandated level necessary to continue paying Extended Benefits to Oregon residents.

The key to making the program work, Zajonc stressed, is building several levels of security into the bonds. Participants will be required to provide substantial collateral, put a portion of the bond proceeds in a special reserve and purchase mortgage insurance, all to assure that the bonds will be repaid. In addition, the Economic Development Department is given limited borrowing authority to assure the liquidity of these funds. Ultimately, though, the participants, and not the state, are responsible for bond repayment.

UC extended benefits end

The extended benefits unemployment insurance program will terminate in Oregon with claims for the week ending July 2, 1983, according to an announcement made today by the Oregon Employment Division. Federal law provides for this 13 week extension during periods of high unemployment. Because of Oregon's improving economy the insured unemployment rate has fallen below the federally mandated level necessary to continue paying Extended Benefits to Oregon residents.

Thorne noted that this leaves unemployed Oregonians with an initial 26 weeks of benefits paid by the state and the 12 weeks of federally financed benefits. He stated, "The federal benefits are scheduled to sunset in September unless Congress extends them."

Business Notes

Oregon retained \$20 million because of a Supreme Court ruling Monday that states may levy corporate income taxes on multinational corporations on a "unitary" basis. The 5-3 vote upheld California's corporate tax system which requires corporations to pay taxes to the state based on a share of worldwide operations. Oregon is one of 11 other states using the same method for taxing multinational companies. The unitary tax system is used to prevent corporations from using accounting "shell games" to shift profits out of the United States to countries with lower tax rates.

"Severe shortages" exist in the nation's supply of minority doctors, dentists, pharmacists and veterinarians according to a study released June 16. The study, conducted for the Association of Minority Health Professions Schools, said predictions of impending surpluses of physicians and other health professionals simply do not apply to blacks. The study cites reductions in federal funding as "increasing the already considerable economic barriers to black health professions students."

The Grantsmanship Center, this country's oldest and largest fundraising training institution, is coming to Portland July 27 to 29. A three-day training program on how to get grants from foundations and corporations is open to the staff of any local organization. The State Employment Division reports continued need for raspberry pickers in East Multnomah County. "We're running buses out of our office at 6 a.m. every morning," said Tom Ellis, employment specialist at the division's office at 660 S.E. 160th Ave. Depending on the grower, pay ranges from 12 cents to 17 cents a pound.

Investor Rehabilitation Loans from the Portland Development Commission are available to maintain and upgrade commercial property and multi-family housing in six North and Northeast Portland neighborhoods. Under an IRL, a private lender makes a loan commitment at market rates and the City provides the balance at 3%, up to 50% of the total rehabilitation costs.
