

Second Notice of Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at the Portland Building, 1120 S.W. 5th Avenue, Second Floor, Meeting Room "C" at 10:00 a.m., Monday, July 25, 1983 for the purpose of considering projects for which federal assistance under Section 3 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended is being sought.

The total grant application is for \$3,840,652 of which \$3,072,521 is the Federal share and \$768,131 is the local share. The projects included in this application are:

1) land acquisition and engineering for the Beaverton Transit Center to be located on a 4.7 acre parcel of currently undeveloped land approximately 1000 ft. west of S.W. 117th Avenue and 700 ft. north of the Tualatin Valley Highway in central Beaverton.

2) land acquisition, engineering and construction of the Hillsboro Transit Center and Park-and-Ride lot located just west of downtown Hillsboro on a 6.25 acre site bounded by Washington St., Adams Ave., Baseline Rd., and Dennis Ave.

3) two Westside Transportation System Management (TSM) projects including a) engineering and construction of a bus-pullout and passenger waiting area on south (in-bound) side of Sunset Highway at Sylvan and b) engineering and construction of a new bus only ramp, traffic island and traffic signal at N.W. 10th and Lovejoy.

No persons, families, or businesses will be displaced by these projects.

Environmental assessments with findings of no significant impact for the Beaverton Transit Center, Hillsboro Transit Center and Park-and-Ride have been prepared and are available for public inspection at the Tri-Met Administration offices. The two Westside TSM projects are categorically excluded as they do not have any significant environmental impacts.

In keeping with Tri-Met's policy regarding designs of facilities, transit centers and park and ride lots will promote accessibility through widened sidewalks, wheelchair ramps, specially designated parking spaces for the elderly and handicapped.

The projects are currently under review by the A-95 Clearinghouse and will be included in the FY '83 annual element of the Transportation Improvement Program.

A statement of Tri-Met's proposed charter bus service is available for inspection at the Tri-Met Administration offices.

Tri-Met will not be engaging in school bus operations.

There will be no direct impact on private transportation enterprise by these projects.

At the hearing, Tri-Met will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic and environmental aspects of the projects. Interested persons may submit, orally or in writing, evidence and recommendations with respect to the project.

Second Notice of Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at the Portland Building, 1120 S.W. 5th Avenue, Second Floor, Meeting Room "C" at 10:00 a.m., Monday, July 25, 1983 for the purpose of considering application to the Urban Mass Transportation Administration for funding for preliminary engineering (P.E.), preparation of a final environmental impact statement (FEIS), community involvement and financing activities for the Sunset Light Rail Transit (LRT) Project. The Sunset LRT line would consist of a two-track, twelve-mile rail link between downtown Portland and Washington County. The route would begin with a track connection to the Banfield LRT line in downtown Portland, then proceed westerly, parallel to the Sunset Highway and Highway 217 to Beaverton. In Beaverton it would run alongside the Burlington Northern Railroad and thence through open countryside in Washington County as far as 185th Avenue. The total project cost for P.E., FEIS, community involvement and financing activities is \$1,499,286. The proposed funding is available from two sources as follows: 1) the initial application is for \$500,000 of Interstate Transfer Funds (title 23 U.S.C. 103(e) (4)), with \$88,235 local share (total \$588,235) and 2) the remaining \$911,050 is to be included in the FY '84 Program of Projects and application for funds available under Section 9 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended (\$728,840 - federal; \$182,210 - local).

No persons, families or businesses will be displaced by the activities covered by this grant application.

The projects included in this application are classes of action which are categorically excluded because they do not involve any significant environmental impacts.

The special needs of the elderly and handicapped related to this project will be addressed through incorporating their input under the Community Involvement portion of the project.

The projects are currently under review by the A-95 Clearinghouse and will be included in the FY '83 annual element of the Transportation Improvement Program.

A statement of Tri-Met's proposed charter bus service is available for inspection at the Tri-Met Administration offices. Tri-Met will not be engaging in school bus operation. There will be no direct impact on private transportation enterprise by this project.
