ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS
The City of Springfield, Oregon, desires to increase its pool of known and qualified potential bidders on its public improvement projects. Typical projects recently have included street construction and installation of storm and sanitary sewers.
In accordance with Oregon's revised statutes and the Springfield City Code, no bid will be accepted from a bidder on any project for which the estimated cost is more than \$10,000 unless that bidder is pre-qualified. Potential bidders must file a statement for prequalification at least 30 days prior to any bid opening on forms available from the City's Department of Public Works. Prequalification needs to be done only once in any calendar year.
In lieu of the above prequalification statement, the Department of Public Works will accept a certified copy of a letter of prequalification sent to the bidder by the State of Oregon Department of Transportation or Department of General Services.
