

# Business Notes

**Internal Revenue Service Commissioner Roscoe Egger, Jr. is just tickled.** In response to his first-ever appeal on the 1982 tax form for contributions to reduce the federal deficit, dollars have been pouring into the Treasury. Through the second week of May \$276,557.10 had been received from 3,313 contributors. The checks — all deductible as charitable contributions — ranged in size from 1 cent to \$25,000.

**A plan for overcoming the corporate sector's trend toward investing capital overseas** will include "worker funds" empowered to buy shares in publicly held companies and thus give employees participation in the ownership and control of Swedish industry. The funds will be financed by a 20 percent levy on excess profits plus an additional 0.29% payroll tax and will be controlled by boards on which trade union representatives comprise a majority. The funds will have a cumulative budget of more than \$250 million a year, enough to give them ownership of 7% of Swedish shares by 1990.

**Portland General Electric recently attacked the Aluminum Industry's campaign** for a special reduction in electric rates. A PGE study on Bonneville Power Administration rates for the aluminum companies disputes findings of a survey conducted for the aluminum companies and the conclusions reached in recent advertising against the rate increase.

First, BPA's current rates are "competitive" rather than among the highest of any North American region, according to Robert McCullough, manager of regulatory finance and Charles Allcock, branch manager of load forecasting for PGE. Their survey of regions found the Ohio Valley, the Gulf Coast and the Tennessee Valley Authority had higher power rates. The Battelle Northwest report frequently quoted by the aluminum companies has only the TVA with higher rates.

Second, PGE concludes aluminum prices, not power rates, were the determining factor in keeping aluminum plants in or out of operation.

**The major worry now in the state is that higher interest rates will abort the recovery in the wood products industry,** which appeared to many to be leading the state out of the current depression. Mortgage rates have been slowly rising over the last few weeks and several major banks recently raised their "prime" interest rate on loans to "preferred" customers from 10 1/2 to 11 percent. And there is now fear that the Federal Reserve System will undertake actions which will cause interest rates to increase even more.
