BUSINESS NOTES

William F. Gwinn, a state real estate commissioner since 1979, has been appointed by Governor Victor Atiyeh as administrator of the State Housing Division. He replaces Gregg Smith, who resigned in August.

A Brookings Institution study shows that only 45 percent of the 10 million official unemployed received unemployment compensation last year, with only 36 percent drawing in recent weeks. This is down from 78 percent during the 1975 recession.

Economic development efforts should concentrate on attracting and nurturing new start-up firms with great potential rather than branches of firms from elsewhere. This was the message of Leland F. Smith, senior vice-president of the Grubb and Ellis real estate company last Friday for his audience at the Beaverton Area Chamber of Commerce. Smith told of an effort in California where his firm is inventorying all vacant structures with more than 100,000 square feet in economically depressed communities. That information can then be combined with data on economic development incentives to help firms locate in those areas.

"One of the most successful teachers' strikes in California" resulted in a 14 percent wage raise over two years according to Oakland Education Association president Roger Gooden. A four-day walkout by the 3,500-member union was supported by 90 percent of the teachers and 77 percent of their students.

The nation's raw-steel output was 1,664,000 tons last week, up 1.4 percent from 1,641,000 tons the previous week, the American Iron and Steel Institute said.

Last week's raw-steel output was 40.7 percent more than the 1,183,000 tons produced a year earlier.

The industry used 57.7 percent of its capability last week, compared with 56.9 percent the previous week and 40 percent a year earlier.

Wendy's International Inc., a Dublin, Ohio-based fast-food chain, confirmed that it will serve Pepsi instead of Coke in its company-owned restaurants everywhere except Atlanta, hometown of Coca-Cola, Inc.

The move comes four months after Burger King Corp., a Pillsbury Co. unit, decided to switch its 3,200 U.S. restaurants to Pepsi from Coke. And it is yet another sign that Pepsi, the No. 2-ranked soft-drink maker, has become increasingly aggressive and willing to discount its sales of fountain syrup to restaurants to outbid Coke in a market Coke has traditionally dominated.

OABA is encouraging Blacks to run for public office and to support candidates who will be responsive to the issues of the Black community.

Henry stated, "OABA will be using resources from within the Black community as well as outside resources to assist in the development of this greater political awareness. One of the untapped resources within the Black community is the Blacks who are elected officials."

"There are, today, nine Blacks who are elected officials in Ore-

gon," the OABA president noted. They are: State Senator Bill McCoy, Portland; State Representative Jim Hill, Salem; Multnomah Circuit Court Judge Mercedes Diez; Multnomah District Court Judge Aaron Brown, Jr.; Multnomah County Commissioner Gladys McCoy; Portland City Commissioner Charles Jordan; Gladstone City Councilman Jewel Hines; Portland School Board Member Herb Cawthorne; and Beaverton School Board Member James Harris.
