CONSTRUCTION OF THE SHELLEY STREET IMPROVEMENT FROM WILLIAMS AVENUE TO 30TH AVENUE.

The proposed work consists of: The construction of 400 lineal feet of roadbed grading, base rock, alternate: Portland Cement Concrete Pavement or Asphaltic Concrete Pavement surface, and performance of such additional incidental work as is called for by the plans and specifications.

Plans, specifications and other bid documents may be inspected and obtained at the office of the City of Salem, Department of Public Works, 555 Liberty Street S.E., Room 325, Salem, Oregon. The bidder shall not file the book of "Standard Construction Specifications" with his bid.

Bids shall be made on the forms furnished by the City, addressed, and mailed or delivered to the City Recorder, City Hall, Room 205, Salem, Oregon, in a sealed envelope plainly marked "BID ON THE SHELLEY STREET IMPROVEMENT," and the name and address of the bidder.

A surety bond, cashier's check or certified check of the bidder, made payable to the City of Salem, in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the bid must accompany each bid as security. Bid security of all save the three lowest bidders will be returned following the bid opening; all bid security will be refunded upon execution of the contract by the successful bidder.

No bid will be received or considered by the City of Salem unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder that the provisions of ORS 279.350 shall be included in his contract.

No bid shall be received from any bidder who has not filed a prequalification statement with the City Purchasing Supervisor, 1340 20th Street S.E., Salem, Oregon 97302, on or before Nov. 29, 1983. Upon City approval of the submitted prequalification application, the bidder will receive a valid proposal for bidding purposes.

Prequalification Class: Bidder shall prequalify in the appropriate class dependent upon the alternate selected for bid proposal. Prequalification in "Asphalt Concrete Pavement" is required for "Alternate A (A.C.)" and prequalification in "Portland Cement Pavement" is required for "Alternate B (P.C.C.)"

Bidder may submit a bid proposal on either or both alternates.

The project is to be assisted, in whole or in part, with Federal Funds made available under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. 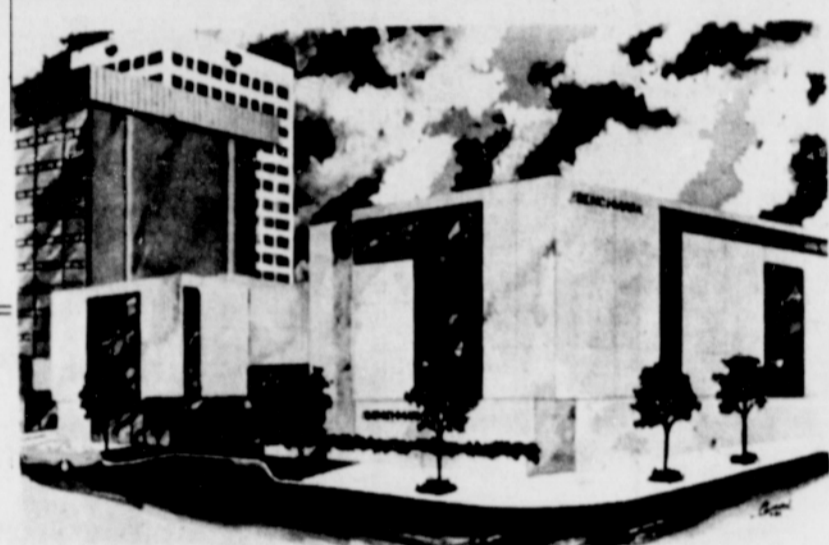

The Benchmark Hotel in downtown Memphis, Tennessee, will open November 17th.

Benchmark project wins award

The Benchmark Hotel in downtown Memphis, Tennessee, has received the Most Outstanding Renovation Award in national competition. The Benchmark was selected from among 1200 construction projects in the United States. Winners in other categories included the U.S. Pavilion at the Worlds Fair in Knoxville, Tennessee, and the Chicago Zoo.

The \$4.6 million hotel, located only 2 blocks from world renowned Beale Street in Memphis, will celebrate its National Grand Opening Nov. 17th to mark the official completion of the 120-room facility. The Benchmark Hotel was developed by New Memphis Development Corp., a minority economic development

corporation headquartered in Memphis. The firm was founded by Memphis business leader Frank Banks in 1976.

Mabra Holeyfield, president of NMDC, said, "We're very proud to be presented with this prestigious award. The Benchmark Hotel is a project NMDC has spent three years working on and when it opens on Nov. 17th it will be the most modern and luxurious minority-owned hotel facility in the U.S."

The Benchmark will feature four spacious luxury suites, a full service restaurant serving authentic Beale Street Cuisine, a Grand Ballroom with capacity for 300 guests and the Cheer's Lounge for live entertainment.

Thai visits refugee program

The Southeast Asian Refugee Federation and its officers were greatly honored recently by a visit from Ah-Ram Kotikula of Thailand, who was returning home from a trade mission in Canada. Mr. Kotikula holds the position as Executive Director of the Association of Thai Industries and also functions as the Secretary General of the Association of S.E. Asian Nations (ASEAN) Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

The special visit was arranged by Tom Sherrett, a new staff member of SEARF's fast growing Economic Development Project. Mr. Sherrett is a former employee of Mr. Kotikula's having served as an outside consultant to the Association of Thai Industry.

SEARF's staff in conjunction with some members of the SEARF Board of Directors held a meeting with Mr. Kotikula, to give him an idea of the objectives, personnel, history, and the various component parts that make up SEARF's programs. He expressed extreme surprise at the way SEARF's multi-ethnic staff is able to work in close harmony. He viewed the multi-ethnic make-up of SEARF's personnel as somewhat of a parallel to Southeast Asian people working together in ASEAN, the regional based organization he is a part of.

On looking at the Economic Development program, Mr. Kotikula urged SEARF to increase contacts with the U.S. Chamber of Com-

merce offices in Washington D.C., and said he would write a note to the President of that organization in order to make him aware of the work that is going on here in Oregon on behalf of refugee resettlement efforts. Other comments on SEARF's programs reflected Mr. Ah-Ram's ideas that a services provider from the U.S. might develop and implement some orientation and familiarization programs that might be implemented in Thailand and around the other countries in Southeast Asia where these temporary camps exist. These programs could be directed towards those refugees who are earmarked to come to the U.S. in the near future. SEARF, in fact, has recently developed Audio Visual Training Packages for refugee populations in the areas of Health Care and Food Sanitation under the direction of the Family Outreach Program and Khandthaly Thammavong.

Kotikula met with Dr. Pradith Chourath's Laotian Organization and discussed with them the events in Asia and the prospects for the future of these displaced citizens and their homeland. The natural friendship of Thai citizens and Lao people emerged as the evening progressed and mutual support and friendship were pledged. Mr. Kotikula expressed much feeling for the Lao refugees and their new lives and wished that he could stay in contact with them somehow or perhaps be of some service to them through his official capacity.
