NAACP presents Image awards

LOS ANGELES—The Hollywood Palladium was the setting for the 16th Annual Image Awards presented by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. More than 1,300 prominent guests and anxious fans witnessed the presentation of 29 awards to recording artists and performers of the theatre, movies, television and sports. Special awards were given to Coretta Scott King (NAACP Key of Life Award); Quincy Jones and Michael Jackson (who shared the Entertainment of the Decade Award). Standing ovations were given to astronaut Lt. Col. Guion S. Bluford, Jr., and Rosa Parks. Mayor Tom Bradley presented television producer Aaron Spelling with the NAACP Humanitarian Award, for a gift of more than \$100,000 to Derrick Gordon, a young heart patient victim, who received a life-saving heart transplant.

Rollins, Jr., *For Us the Living: The Medgar Evers Story*; best performance by a supporting actor in a motion picture—Scatman Crothers, *Twilight Zone: The Movie*; best performance by an actress in a motion picture—Jennifer Beals, *Flashdance*; best performance by an actor in a comedy series or special—Sherman Hemsley, *The Jeffersons*; best performance by an actress in a comedy series or special—Marla Gibbs, *The Jeffersons*; best variety special or series special—*Motown 25: Yesterday, Tomorrow, Forever*; best vocal group, Gladys Knight and the Pips; best female artist—Aretha Franklin; best blues artist—Ray Charles; best jazz artist, Al Jarreau; best gospel artist—The Clark Sisters; best national stage play—*Dreamgirls*; best national stage performance by an actor—Larry Riley, *Dreamgirls*; best local stage performance by an actress—Marla Gibbs, *227*; Image Award in football—Marcus Allen, Los Angeles Raiders; Image Award in baseball—Rod Carew, California Angels; Image Award in basketball—Magic Johnson, Los Angeles Lakers; and Image Award in boxing—Larry Holmes.
