### DBE/WBE GOALS

It is the policy of the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) that Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBEs) and Women Business Enterprises (WBEs), as defined in 49 CFR 23.62 and 23.5, respectively, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds from the U.S. Department of Transportation.

In this regard, Tri-Met has established overall goals for Federal Fiscal Year 1983-1984 of 10% DBE and 1% WBE participation in federally-assisted contracts.

Tri-Met has also developed proposed DBE/WBE certification third-party challenge procedures in accordance with 49 CFR 23.69.

## Forestry jobs available

Applications for 1984 summer and seasonal employment in the Forest Service are being accepted only until January 15th, according to Neil B. Opsal, Director of Personnel Management for the Pacific Northwest Region of the USDA Forest Service.

Applicants may submit an application to only one Forest Service Regional Office nationwide. Applicants must be at least 18 years old at the time they report for duty and must be capable of performing arduous work.

Generally, about 4,000 seasonal jobs are available in the Pacific Northwest Region of the Forest Service (Oregon and Washington) each year. These include aids and technicians in forestry, range, recreation, fire control, engineering, and sur-

veying and pay from \$5 to \$6 per hour. The term of employment is usually less than three months. In 1983, 11,833 applications were received in the Pacific Northwest Region with 1,300 new hires selected and 3,000 rehired to fill positions. Education, work experience, and availability determine an applicant's chance for employment.

Newly-revised application forms (FS 6100-23, dated Oct. 1983) are available at all Forest Service offices and must be postmarked no later than January 15, 1984, to be considered. These forms are applicable to any Region. Last year's application forms will not be accepted.

All applicants will be given equal consideration without regard to race, color, sex, creed, or national origin.
