Black history shown

Two traveling exhibitions focusing on the labor movement in America will be on view from January 12 through February 13 at the Portland Art Museum, 1219 SW Park, Portland.

The exhibitions, "Images of Labor," and "Building a New World: Black Labor Photographs," depict the world of the American laborer, past and present, and the worker's contribution to our growth as a nation.

In "Images of Labor," 32 contemporary American artists and illustrators have interpreted historically important quotations about labor into works for the eye. The words of Americans Eugene Debs, Mother Jones, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Frances Perkins, Samuel Gompers and 27 others have been visually translated into paintings, drawings, sculpture and constructions by artists such as Alice Neel, Jacob Lawrence, Milton Glaser, and Jack Beal. The exhibition was organized by District 1199 of the

National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees as part of its ongoing Bread and Roses cultural program.

"Building a New World: Black Labor Photographs," chronicles the history of Black labor in the United States and its significant contributions to America's economic development. The exhibition demonstrates the changing attitude toward Black workers in various occupational settings, from the late 19th century to the present. The 50 black-and-white photographs in the exhibition are by a variety of noted photographers including Lewis Hine, Marion Post Wolcott, Gordon Parks and Robert Frank.

The Oregon showing of these exhibitions, circulated by the Smithsonian Institution's Traveling Exhibition Service (SITES), has been made possible by generous contributions from the Oregon Arts Commission, Oregon AFL-CIO, and Black Colleges Committee.

Programs need volunteers

Scope:

Demolition and removal or relocation of two 2-story houses, one detached garage and sheds; demolition and removal of concrete, asphalt concrete pavement and debris; and clearing, grading and seeding approximately 1.5 acres.

A prebid conference will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, January 18, 1984, to discuss all phases of the work. Meet at N.E. 33rd Drive and Elrod Road.

Nuclear hearings set

Public hearings on the Nuclear Weapons Free Zone Ordinance proposed by the citizen lobby, New Clear Vision, will be held during the first week of October, 1984. City Commissioners Charles Jordan, Mike Lindberg and Margaret Strachan voted in favor of the hearings after listening to testimony from City Attorney Jeff Thomas and mayoral candidate Chris Liddicoat. Thomas had been asked by the Council to research the constitutionality of the ordinance, which has never been tested in court. The City Attorney voiced reservations that the ordinance may be found by courts to infringe upon Congress' Constitutional mandate to "provide for the common defense." Liddicoat argued that many nationally respected lawyers are convinced that the ordinance, which would ban local production of nuclear weapons parts, could hold up in court and prove to be constitutional.

A spokesperson for the group

said, "The people of Portland can join us in our effort by calling or writing Jordan, Lindberg and Strachan in support of the ordinance. The production of immoral weapons designed to kill innocent civilians is not the type of industry we want or need in Portland."

Clerk Dennis Nelson of the City Auditor's office is working with the staff of New Clear Vision to schedule the hearings. The group has requested the delay to accommodate the vacation schedules of the City Commissioners and the mayor.

The ordinance has gained the support of Portland Area state representatives Jane Cease, Shirley Gold, and Dick Springer. Endorsers of the ordinance include the Citizens Party, People's National Clearinghouse, Fellowship of Reconciliation, New Jewish Agenda, Northwest Action for Disarmament, and a number of college and university student bodies.
