Sealed bids for West Beach Improvements; Contract A—Dredging, Contract B—Sitework, and Contract C—Gantry Crane Support Structure, Roll-On Roll-Off Dock and Ripping, will be received by the Port of Morrow, Boardman, Oregon until March 13, 1984 at 2:00 p.m., and then will be publicly opened and read. Bids submitted prior to the opening will be received by Wayne Schwandt, Port Manager, Port of Morrow, P.O. Box 200, Boardman, Oregon 97818.

Contract A consists of dredging approximately 40,000 cubic yards from the Columbia River and depositing and compacting this material on the shore.

Contract B consists of sitework including subgrade compaction and supplying, placing, and compacting approximately 5,000 yards of base rock for roadway and storage yard surfaces.

Contract C consists of fabrication and installation of foundations, piling, crane beams, crane rail, fendering systems and support struts for the support of a gantry crane. Also included is bank ripping around the support structure and a turning dolphin. Additive alternates for the fabrication and installation of catwalks and a roll-on roll-off dock structure and foundations are also included.

Contract documents may be examined and obtained February 21, 1984 at the office of Seton, Johnson & Odell, Inc., Consulting Engineers, 133 S.W. Second Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97204, upon receipt of a non-refundable deposit of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each document.

No bid will be considered unless fully completed in the manner provided in the "Instructions to Bidders" upon the form provided by the Engineer and accompanied by a bid bond executed in favor of the Port of Morrow, and in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the bid.

In order to be accepted and considered for award of a contract, the Bidder must be qualified in accordance with applicable parts of the Oregon Revised Statutes Chapter 279. Bid shall contain a statement by the Bidder that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 and U.S. Department of Labor (Workmen on Public Works to be Paid Not Less than Prevailing Rate of Wage) are to be complied with. The bid shall also contain a statement by the Bidder that the Equal Employment Opportunity requirements are to be complied with.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed bid blanks and shall be accompanied by bid security in the form of certified check, cashier's check or surety bond payable to the Port of Morrow in an amount equal to 10% of the bid. The Salem Area Mass Transit District (SAT) is soliciting proposals for an advertising/marketing agency to develop and produce a comprehensive marketing and promotion plan for the SAT. Working with SAT staff, the agency would implement a jointly developed program of marketing promotions designed to inform the public about transit services and to attract new riders. The selected agency will be given an initial review period to evaluate existing market research and promotional activities which have been undertaken in the past year, and will then proceed to work with SAT staff on the annual program.
