

NAACP meeting features Margaret Carter

The Portland Branch, NAACP, will hold its regular monthly meeting on Sunday, March 18th, at 4:00 p.m. at Mount Olivet Baptist Church, 116 N.E. Schuyler. Rev. John Jackson is pastor.

Featured speaker at this meeting will be Margaret Carter, Candidate for House District 18. Miss Carter was the winner of the District 18 Community Forum last November 4th—an early attempt to concentrate on one Black candidate for the District. Miss Carter is a Portland Community College Counselor. Carter will face the incumbent, Ed Leek; Harold Williams, who has run twice before; and Gayle Troutwine. Leek and Troutwine are white.

District 18, dubbed a "Black"

district, actually has 54 per cent white population. Carter supports a "Business Enterprise Zone" for the district, provided new plants are closely regulated to prevent abuses. She is keenly interested in having businesses and plants within the district that will provide employment.

"NAACP does not endorse candidates," Hazel G. Hays, Branch President, explained. "We will introduce any candidate who may be present at our meetings." Because the District 18 Community Forum has put forward Margaret Carter as the result of their vote, we are making this opportunity to become further acquainted with her and her program." The public is invited.

The Portland Branch's last

meeting before the May 15th Primary is April 15th. At that time, Senator Bill McCoy, Oregon's only Black Senator will be challenged by two white aspirants—Representative Wally Priestley and Bill Stevenson, former State Senator and Labor Commissioner.

Trials for ACTSO (Afro-American Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics) have started and the first meeting will be held at Bethel A.M.E. Church on March 24th. For further information call Gail Washington, 285-3056 after 6:00 p.m. Final competition is slated for May 27th.
