LENORA MORRIS, author of *The Ebony Princesses of the Portland Rose Festival*, has joined with ten other Portland families to become a part of the Lewis and Clark College Friendship Family Program which aims to provide a caring family for each visiting foreign student. In this program students live on the campus but are allowed to leave the campus to be with their host family whenever it is mutually agreeable.

Jean Vanderwoude, foreign student advisor, and Greg Caldwell, director of the Language Institute of the college, worked with Jan McCarthy, coordinator of the program to bring twelve students from Hoksei Gakuen University in Sapporo, Japan, recently. The students expect to concentrate on the study of English and English literature during their one-year residency in America. In Sapporo, 22 students from Lewis and Clark are studying Japanese at Hoksei Gakuen University for the same length of time, according to Vanderwoude. A professor from Hoksei Gakuen, who accompanied the Sapporo students will stay in Portland with them for five or six months.

Hosts and students were excited and pleased to begin the acquaintance with each other and were busy making future plans at a mixer party in Templeton Center on Monday evening.

Mary and Paul Norseth of Portland will be host family to Satomi Yanagisawa of Sapporo. Paul Norseth a retired engineer for the City of Portland, said, "I'm looking forward to Satomi's being with us. We have been host family once before in this program. Our guest the first time was a student from Iran. We enjoyed that experience very much and I think we all benefited from it."

Mary Norseth broke off an animated discussion with Miss Yanagisawa to make an announcement. "We've just discovered that we are both hospital nurses," she beamed.



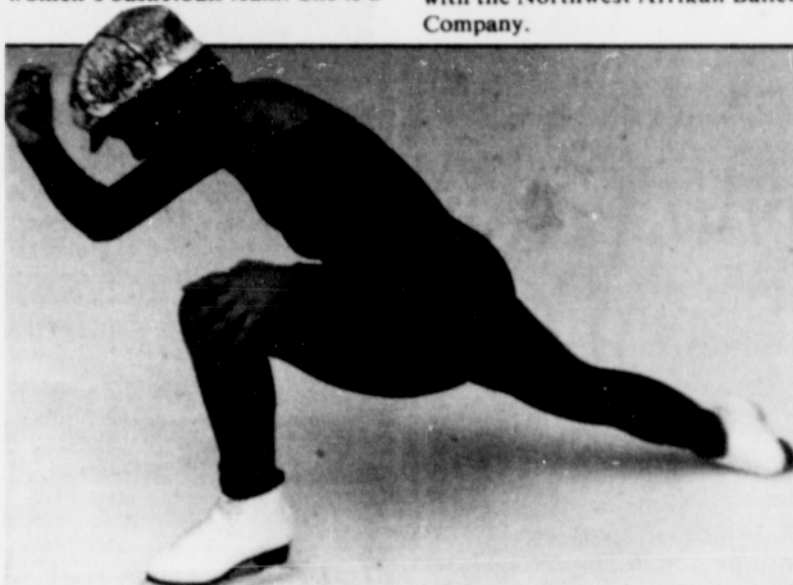
