Zoo seeks teen volunteers

Metro's Washington Park Zoo is looking for teenage volunteers who want to spend their summer catching flies and petting rabbits.

The zoo needs 27 volunteers for the Insect Zoo to work at the exhibit's counter, talk to the public and assist in caring for the live insects. This includes, among other things, catching flies for the praying mantis breakfast.

Also needed are 70 Children's Zoo Volunteers to help the Children's Zoo keeper care for the animals and help demonstrate to the zoo visitors the right way to pet rabbits, guinea pigs and ducks.

Volunteers receive training on how to handle and care for the animals. The Insect Zoo Volunteers will also receive training in insect collecting and study the natural history of insects and arthropods.

Each volunteer works two four-hour shifts per week from June 16th through Labor Day. The applications are accepted on a first-come-first-serve basis. The volunteers must be between the ages of 14-18.
