Sealed bids will be received by the Oregon State Board of Higher Education in Administrative Services Building, B100, Oregon State University, Corvallis, Oregon until 2:00 P.M., PDT, May 31, 1984, for the Milam Hall, Withycombe Hall, Nash Hall, and Rogers Hall Water Line Replacement project located on the campus of Oregon State University, Corvallis, Oregon. Bids will be opened and publicly read aloud in the Administrative Services Building "A", Room A110 by the Undersigned or his designated representative.

The project consists of furnishing all labor, material, equipment, superintendence and doing all work to replace the existing domestic hot and cold water lines within Milam Hall, Withycombe Hall, Nash Hall, and Rogers Hall all in strict accordance with the drawings and specifications.

Separate bids will be received on a lump-sum basis for each of the four buildings as well as for a combined bid for all of the work shown on the drawings and described in the specifications. Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at the Portland Building, 1120 SW 5th Avenue, Second Floor, Meeting Room 'C' at 10:00 a.m., Monday, May 21, 1984, for the purpose of considering a grant amendment application to the Urban Mass Transportation Administration for the addition of ten Automatic Passenger Counters. The cost of the additional counters, including Cost Allocation, will be \$47,600.

No persons, families or businesses will be displaced by this project.

This project does not affect the special needs of the elderly and handicapped.

The project is currently under intergovernmental review by the state and will be included in the FY84 annual element of the Transportation Improvement Program.

The City of Portland intends to apply for approximately \$9,064,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development.

The following is a proposed statement of objectives and projected use of funds for the 1984-85 fiscal year. Citizens are invited to comment on the proposed statement and on the City's performance in carrying out its Housing and Community Development (HCD) Program. Comments received will be considered before submitting the final statement to HUD on June 1, 1984.

Statement of Objectives

The City of Portland retains as its primary Housing and Community Development Program objective the development of viable neighborhoods, including decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income.

Source & Use of Funds

The City proposes to use its 84-85 HCD funds for the following activities:

HOUSING: \$6,967,935

Single Family Rehabilitation Loan program; Multi-Family Housing Assistance; Dangerous Building/Housing Recycle Program.

Submersible raw sewage pumps with semi-open or open impeller design with quick disconnect and lifting accessories, access lid, pump control panel, level regulators and other accessories.
