# Sojourner Truth Poets present new show

The Sojourner Truth Poets are a Portland based group consisting of three professional Black women poets. They perform as an integral part of the Sojourner Truth Theatre, and independently as a totally women-oriented performing arts troupe. The Poets have been instrumental in presenting the works of women, Black women in particular-in drama, comedy, poetry, readers theatre and

theatrical workshops.

On May 26th and 27th at 8 p.m. and 7 p.m. respectively, and again on June 1st and 3rd, at 8 p.m. and 7 p.m., the Poets will present "Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow," a stage production in celebration of the Black woman's creativity in drama, comedy, song, poetry and dance. Tickets are priced at \$4/\$3 students with ID, and can be obtained in blocks or singles.
