Sealed proposals for the construction of the 1984 Expansion of the Newport Wastewater Treatment Plant, addressed to City of Newport, will be received at the office of the City Manager, City of Newport, 810 S.W. Alder St., Newport, Oregon 97365, until 2:00 p.m., local time, on the 15th day of June, 1984, and then will be publicly opened and read.

The work contemplated consists of construction of a mechanical bar screen facility, 60-foot diameter biofilter, three aluminum domes, odor control equipment, pump station modifications, and grit conveyor modifications.

The work will be totally financed by local funds. Drawings and Specifications may be examined in the office of the City Manager, Newport, or at the office of the Engineer, CH2M Hill, 2300 N.W. Walnut Boulevard, Corvallis, Oregon 97339.

Sealed proposals for furnishing all materials, equipment and labor for the construction of water lines for the Hazelwood Water District will be received at the District office at 1017 N.E. 117th Avenue, Portland, Oregon, 97220, until 2:00 p.m., June 5, 1984. Immediately thereafter such proposals will be publicly opened and read. A contract will be awarded or bids rejected within sixty (60) days after the opening.

The proposed work consists of furnish and installing 45 lineal feet of 10-inch diameter, 644 lineal feet of 8-inch diameter and 6,088 lineal feet of 6-inch diameter ductile iron, Class 52 pipe, including corrosion protection miscellaneous lengths of 4- through 10-inch PVC pressure pipe, excavation, backfill, thrust restraint, valves, fittings and appurtenances. Included are six water main crossings of E. Burnside Street encased in Class III Reinforced Concrete Pipe. Crossings range in size from 8" D.I. to 14" D.I. water lines. Also included is the installation of approximately 81 ¾-inch house services, 8 1-inch services, 2 1-½-inch services, and 2 2-inch services which consist of furnishing and installing copper service lines, connections, corporation stops, curb stop, handwheel valves, excavation, backfill, surface restoration and appurtenances.

The PORTLAND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION will receive sealed Bids for BREAKWATER CONSTRUCTION, SOUTH DOWNTOWN WATERFRONT DEVELOPMENT, until 2:00 P.M. Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) on the 31st day of May, 1984 at 1120 S.W. Fifth Avenue, Suite 1102, Portland, Oregon 97204, at which time and place all Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The work consists of driving steel piling, installing concrete floats, and necessary accessories for the South Downtown Waterfront Area Breakwater.

South Trunk Sewer Replacement Project

Sealed Bids for the construction of SANITARY SEWERS, AND MANHOLES in the City of St. Helens, Oregon addressed to the Mayor and City Council, City Hall, 265 Strand Street, P.O. Box 278, St. Helens, Oregon 97051, will be received until 2:30 p.m. local time on the 5th day of June, 1984, in the City Recorder's Office in City Hall, at which time bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The project consists of constructing approximately 6,277 lineal feet of 24, 27, 30 & 33 inch diameter gravity flow trunk sewer; 647 lineal feet of 18-inch diameter steel elevated sewer across the sewage lagoon; and 23 manholes consisting of 48, 54, 60, 72 & 84-inch diameter components.

Prospective Bidders are advised that the work is partially funded by a grant from the State of Oregon Intergovernmental Relations Division and that the work will be subject to the prevailing wage rates established by the U.S. Department of Labor and to Equal Employment Opportunity requirements.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond payable to the City of St. Helens, Oregon in an amount of not less than 10 percent of the total amount of the Bid.
