Request for Qualifications

The Pacific County Public Transportation Benefit Area dba Pacific Transit System, a municipal corporation, is seeking the services of qualified firms for the design of a maintenance facility for a 15-bus fleet. The work under consideration here is anticipated to include preparation of preliminary studies, sketches, layout plans and reports; cost estimates of the proposed project and of all structures, utilities and appurtenances; master planning indicating the configuration, siting, and integrated arrangements of all structures, roadways, utilities and support areas; and preparation of final designs, plans, and specifications for construction.

Responses to this request shall include the following sections:

1. **QUALIFICATIONS:** For the proposed project members, list names qualifications and experience.

2. **REFERENCES:** List references (name, phone numbers, and addresses) of former and present customers for similar services as those requested here.

3. **AVAILABILITY:** The proposed project is expected to begin during July of 1984 and must be completed by March 1, 1985. Address current projects and expected future projects for the proposed project members in reference to the above timetable.

4. **DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES:** Discuss any proposed subcontracting to minority, women-owned or disadvantaged business enterprises. This section should include a description of the firm's efforts to obtain disadvantaged business enterprise participation.

Finalists will be expected to appear for an interview on anticipated concepts and relative utility of methods of approach for furnishing the required services.

The RFQ is subject to financial assistance from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Washington State Department of Transportation.
