Kermit's Kare for Kids to air

Kermit Washington, former Portland Trail Blazer, is spearheading a unique fund-raising effort for Doernbecher Children's Hospital, a part of Oregon Health Sciences University, and the state's major referral center for intensive pediatric care.

Entitled "Kermit's Kare for Kids" Campaign, this state-wide project is co-sponsored by Pepsi Cola Bottling Company of Portland, who has produced 30,000 special Pepsi Can Collection "Banks"; Far West Federal Banks and Round Table Pizza Restaurants, who will serve as distribution sites for the collection banks; and Safeway Stores, who will have donation displays in all of their stores.

Participants can pick up their Pepsi Can Bank at any Far West Federal Bank or Round Table Pizza Restaurant, and, after filling them with contributions, return them to any Far West Federal Bank, to KGW-TV Studios, or to Doernbecher Children's Hospital, 14th Floor, located at Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland. Kermit's Campaign will continue

until mid-June.

The Top Twenty Collectors who have turned in their cans prior to the 1984 Doernbecher Children's Hospital Telethon, scheduled to air for 21 hours on KGW-TV, June 2-3, will be invited to appear during the broadcast. The Top Twenty Collectors from the entire campaign period will be Kermit's special guests at a private Celebration Party held in their honor. In addition, "Kermit Kares for Kids ...Me Too!" T-shirts will be available to all participants who have collected \$25.00 or more and free 2-liter bottle coupons from Pepsi will be given to the first 100 collectors returning their filled banks to Far West Federal Banks or Round Table Pizza Restaurants.

"Kermit's Kare For Kids" Campaign is being held in conjunction with the 1984 Doernbecher Children's Hospital Telethon to be broadcast on KGW-TV, June 2-3. This is a unique Telethon in that 100% of the monies raised will stay in Oregon to benefit Doernbecher Children's Hospital.

Individuals participating in this 30-hour dance marathon will have a pledge for every step that's made. Team dancing will also occur where team members will be able to take turns on the dance floor to compete for the 30-hour endurance record.

Registration begins at the Pine Street Theatre, S.E. 9th and Pine, Friday, June 1st through June 2nd. Registered marathon dancers will be given free admission, food and drink.

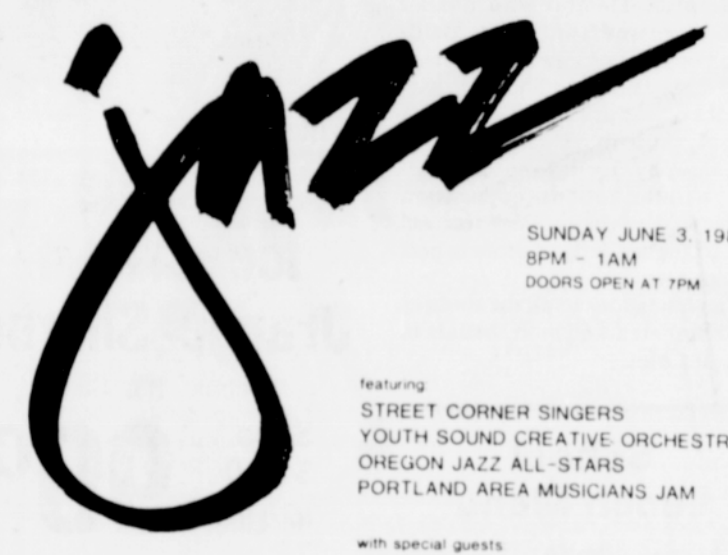
