political disenfranchisement of the national birthright of the indigenous African population." Though Frank Sinatra raked in a cool \$1.8 million for his Sun City performances and happily received an award from Bophuthatswana's "president", others have refused lucrative offers. Roberta Flack turned down a reported \$2.5 million. Diana Ross, The Commodores, Third World, Tony Bennett and Gladys Knight have also rejected South African gold. Last September, Harry Belafonte and Arthur Ashe launched Artists and Athletes

Against Apartheid to coordinate the national cultural boycott campaign. Portlanders Organized for Southern African Freedom, as the local initiator of the boycott effort, is appealing to concert-goers to shun Johnny Mathis unless he pledges not to return to apartheid South Africa.
