He plays all of Sonny Boy's tunes as well as songs by Howlin' Wolf, Little Walter and Jimmy Reed. Although this is the first national tour for the band, Frank Frost has toured with B.B. King, Albert King, Little Milton and Johnny Taylor. He has also played Country and Rock-a-Billy with Conway Twitty and Carl Perkins.
