All bids to be publicly opened and read aloud.

Deposits made upon procurement of drawings, specifications, and forms of Contract Documents will be refunded upon the return thereof in good condition by actual bidders within the ten (10) days after the opening of bids. Non-bidders deposits will be refunded if documents are returned, in good condition, no later than 15 days from date of bid opening. Deposits retained will cover cost of printing. Individual sheets and specifications pages may be purchased for the cost of reproduction: Drawings - \$1.00 per sheet; Specifications - \$0.25 per sheet.

Bidders must pre-qualify with owner via the Engineer, on Standard APWA Prequalification Forms, ten (10) days prior to bid opening. Prequalification forms may be obtained from, and should be submitted to the Engineer. If a prequalification form is on file with the Engineer and is not over one year old, re-filing is not necessary unless there has been a substantial change in Contractor's status.

The Offeror's or Bidder's attention is called to the "Equal Opportunity Clause", the "Standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications", and "Section 3" Requirements, set forth herein.

The Contractor's compliance with the Executive Order and the regulation in CFR Part 60-4 shall be based on its implementation of the Equal Opportunity Clause, specific affirmative action obligation required by the specifications set forth in 41 CFR 50-4.3 (a), and its effort to meet the goals established for the geographical area where the contract resulting from this solicitation is to be performed. The hours of minority and female employment and training must be substantially uniform throughout the length of the contract and in each trade and the Contractor shall make a good faith effort to employ minorities and women evenly on each of its projects. The transfer of minority or female employees or trainees from Contractor to Contractor or from project to project for the sole purpose of meeting the Contractor goals shall be a violation of the contract, the Executive Order and regulations in 41 CFR Part 60-4. Compliance with the goals will be measured against the total work hours performed.

The Contractor shall provide a written notification to the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs within 10 working days of award of any construction subcontract in excess of \$10,000 at any tier of construction work under the contract resulting from this solicitation. The notification shall list the name, address and telephone number of the subcontractor, employer identification number, estimated dollar amount of the subcontract; estimated starting and completion dates of the subcontract, and the geographical area in which the contract is to be performed.

As used in this notice and in the contract resulting from this solicitation, the covered area is the City of Amity.

Prospective contractors for work in connection with Section 3 covered projects will be required to provide, prior to the signing of the contract, a preliminary statement of work force needs (skilled, semiskilled, unskilled labor and trainees by category) where known; where not known, such information shall be supplied prior to the signing of any contract between contractors and their subcontractors.

The City of Amity reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive all informalities. No bidder may withdraw or modify his bid after the hour set for the opening and thereafter until the lapse of forty-five (45) days from the bid.
