Monday night was to send an indelible signal to the KBOO Board, the final authority, that Afro-American programmers and their listeners desired no changes in the programming.

They were successful. The board and program director, Bill Wax capitulated to the demands of the community and—the Black programmers. Wax said, "At this point, I can accept the 'no change' policy in the strip." Wax also requested a third party to help mediate the conflict he has had with various Black programmers.

The board agreed to, "No changes in the Black strip for one year without consultation with the Afro-American advisory committee. Including, a discussion of the concept of self-determination."

L.C. Earnest, president of the board, said, "The agreement will give us enough time where the Afro-American programmers can develop a little security and the board a little consciousness."

In voicing their support of Black programming, the majority of residents, both Black and white, indicated how pleased they were with the programming and it filled a communication void in Portland. A small group calling themselves Black feminists felt they had been manipulated by the call from programmers to come to the meeting when the programming process was not completed. But their objections dissipated to a whisper over the voice of the majority who understood why Black programmers had to call them to the meeting.

Ronnie Herndon said, "So often in this country whenever Black people have gotten something we've had to pay a very dear price. If the discussion comes around to changing the Black strip, then it is a real threat to us. It is not an academic discussion anymore when we've seen too often that academic discussion leads to reality."

Brigitte Denis-Sarabi, KBOO's station manager, noted "Diversity does not always lend itself to unity. But both are what community radio is all about."

The Afro-American programmers and supporters agreed and after the four-hour board meeting, they felt the motion by the board put the "community" back into community radio.

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TENANT SERVICES COORDINATOR

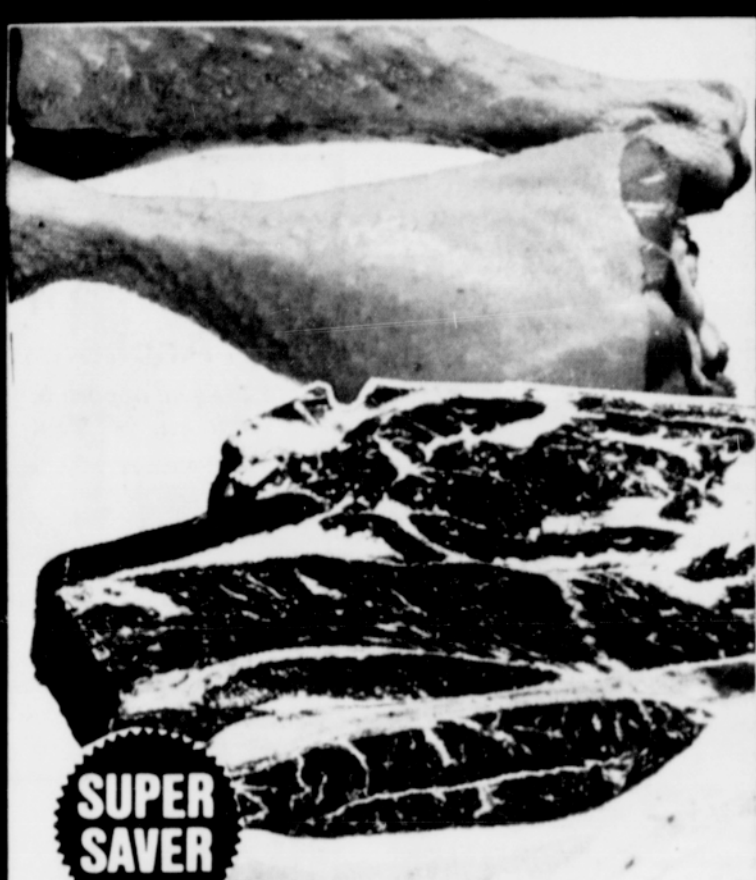
