Marijuana spraying

(Continued from Page 1, Column 3)

Coalition for Alternatives to Pesticides, said the Draft Environmental Impact Statement for DEA's spraying program does not comply with court-ordered regulations for such documents. Greer added several specific points: the document refers to studies not available to the public; it doesn't include EPA studies on 2,4-D; it says the adverse affects of a "worst-case" spill would be negligible, and it does not include reference to an Eastern Oregon herbicide spill in 1983 that killed all wildlife downstream of Willow Creek for 20 miles.

Paul Merrell, who has sued the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and other agencies over the spraying of herbicides near his Southern Oregon home, said a federal injunction on all spraying of Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management lands was ordered March 1st of this year by Judge James Burns.

About half of the approximately 40 people who testified Wednesday

expressed the sentiment that the best way to get marijuana off federal lands is to legalize it. The DEA suspects 2,000 plots of marijuana are now being grown on federal land in Oregon. Public lands are often used for growing marijuana because, if the plants are found, it is much more difficult to identify and prosecute the grower.

The spraying of paraquat is only one of four methods the DEA is considering, according to the report, although the report states it is their preference.

Paraquat is a fast-acting herbicide that dries out plants and weeds within hours. According to the DEA, the effect of paraquat on humans is minimal and lasts about two days. The report says it is "highly improbable" that contaminated marijuana would hit the streets.

But Sajo said sprayed marijuana was likely to hit the streets and even more likely to fall into the hands of teenagers, who would not be likely to recognize contaminated marijuana.
